Paul and Helen will be moving into the Rectory on 5th October but Paul will not commence his duties in Southern Vales until after his ordination.

I am very much looking forward to being your Priest Assistant at the Southern Vales Parish.

Helen and I have had the opportunity to have a break with a 10 day South Pacific cruise late in August and early September, before I returned to work for a couple of weeks finishing up as the ABC News Editor, Illawarra based in Wollongong, a position I have held over the past 15 years. There has been a round of farewells for Helen and me over the past two weeks at the ABC in Sydney and in Wollongong, and at St Luke's Mosman in Sydney, which I have been very humbled by.

As I write this, I have today received at the final farewell a thank you letter from the ABC Managing Director, Mark Scott and a plaque commemorating 25 years with the organisation, both in New South Wales and South Australia. As I close this chapter in my life, I am excited about the move back to South Australia and my impending ordination on the 18th of October and my first Mass at McLaren Vale the next day. Helen and I hope that as many of you as possible will be able to attend both services.

#### Resignation of Bishop Ross Davies

A letter from Bishop Ross Davies was read out on Sunday 26th announcing his resignation from the Diocese due to ill health We wish him a speedy recovery. A letter from Archdeacon Seabrook was also read out, outlining details of the Bishop's departure Copies of the letters may be obtained from your Wardens.

Archdeacon Seabrook continues as Administrator of the Diocese of The Murray, as well as Parish Priest of Mt Barker and having oversight of this Pastoral District . We appreciate his heavy load and keep him in our prayers.

## News from September Parish Council

Our meeting this time was chaired by Archdeacon Richard Seabrook, in the Sunday School Room. Matters discussed included:

#### \* Maintenance of St Philip & St James:

Rupert Best had been involved in consultation with the Heritage architect and the structural engineer regarding the condition of the eastern end of the building. Major repairs can't be started until the building is stabilized. Deep underpinning is required for the walls and a quote is to be obtained. Grave sites close to the building present a difficulty in planning for the underpinning.

- \* Rectory Maintenance: (see also p. 5) With the Rectory vacant some further maintenance had been attended to: curtains were being replaced in the main and second bedrooms, and lace curtains had been replaced across the front of the house (thank you Di Best for making all of the latter.) Carpets were being shampooed. The doorbell and the oven still needed attention. Paintwork was still alright but Fr Richard suggested that one room of the Rectory be painted each year to avoid major costs at any time.
- \* **ABM Sunday:** Fr Martin and Anne Chittleborough would speak about ABM at the Sunday services on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October. Any money received in a retiring collection to be sent to St Margaret's Hospital, Oro Bay in the Diocese of Popondota (see p. 8)
- \* **Insurance valuations** for parish buildings and contents had been sent to the Diocese. A complete reassessment had been done for St Philip & St James, Old Noarlunga (including the value of its stained glass window) and St Stephen's, Willunga.
- \* Stewardship envelopes: It would be encouraging for people to know what the money they give is actually used for and what expenses need to be met. New people to be encouraged to take up stewardship commitments.
- \* Changed service times: So that Fr Paul would not be rushing from one service to another on Sundays but could spend some time with the congregations after the services, Archdeacon Seabrook requested some changes in service times which should come into effect as soon as possible after Fr Paul's arrival. Services to change to 10.30 am at St Margaret's from 25<sup>th</sup> November, and for St Philip & St James and St Ann's a change to 8.30 am would begin the following Sunday, 31<sup>st</sup> October. (The different date would allow for a baptism with interstate visitors on the 25<sup>th</sup>.) **See service times on back page.** Summertime daylight saving would begin on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October, and the matter of service times could be reviewed at the end of summer.
- \* Gift to Fr Paul and Helen: A box of items was being donated for their pantry.
- \* Letter to Fr Ross Davies: PD Council approved Mary Blagrove's suggestion that the Parish Secretary write to our retired bishop to thank him for good things he had achieved during his episcopacy.

Financial Reports were tabled: Total income for August Total expenses for August Operating profit Total donations to missions \$3,892.23 Total income YTD \$44,493 Total income YTD \$37,040 Total giving to missions \$3,340

In the absence of the Treasurer, Rupert Best will be a signatory to Parish accounts.

**Parish Council meetings** will now be chaired by Fr Richard (see below), and will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month. Next meeting Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> November, 7 pm at St Margaret's, McLaren Vale.

#### A Letter from the Administrator of the Diocese of The Murray:

It will be a cause of rejoicing and giving thanks to God as we welcome Father Paul Devenport to the Pastoral District of Southern Vales to be the priest in this community. He comes not as the Rector or the Parish Priest but as Priest Assistant, licensed to me. Fr Paul comes as a priest in training, a newly ordained priest and his placement in the Pastoral District of Southern Vales is to enable him to develop as a priest in God's Church.

As Administrator, because there is currently no Bishop and because Father Paul will hold my licence and be licensed to me, I will have oversight of the Pastoral District, responsible for Father Paul and will carry out certain functions as, in effect, your parish priest. For example, I will chair the PD Council meetings, give direction on Father Paul's ministry, give agreement to rosters and so on. If there are any issues regarding his ministry among you, I will be the person to whom you should refer and not Father Paul. I am aware that I have not had, so far, many dealings with the PD but I pray that, alongside my principal task as Rector of Mount Barker and my secondary task as Administrator, I may guide Father Paul as he begins his work as a priest and guide the pastoral district as best I can...albeit from afar!

I send you my prayers and best wishes.

#### Back to Church Sunday, 12th September

At St. Margaret's, McLaren Vale the congregation increased with five visitors. This was Fr Phil's last service at this church. The newly mown grounds and the spring flowers in the Rectory garden made a welcoming sight.

Accounts of the day included the following:

I saw visitors in the church cemetery on the Saturday. I introduced myself and during the conversation I suggested they might like to attend the service on the Sunday. The family had attended this church a few years ago. The daughter joined us on the Sunday morning.

A couple had recently moved permanently to live locally but had continued to worship in Adelaide. They saw the Back to Church Sunday notice in <u>On the Coast</u> and decided to attend the Vigil Mass on the Saturday at Willunga. They indicated that they would attend St Ann's or St Stephen's in the future.

# Lesotho books project —an update



In February 2010 David and Liz Linn spoke at one of the St Ann's Lenten Suppers about a project to send books to schools in Lesotho. Following the talk, a donation of \$120 was sent to assist this work.

A newsletter from the Linns says: Each time we report progress on packing books or on the fundraising effort, we receive huge thanks from Lesotho. The books are being used to establish (and in some cases now to enlarge) libraries in Primary, and increasingly in Secondary/ High "nation building".

9,431 books were sent in a recent shipment which should arrive in Lesotho in early October.

The newsletter goes on to thank those who have contributed to the project, "including the Anglican Pastoral District of Southern Vales [which] included the project in their Lenten Soup Suppers and sent a 'small cheque' of \$120!!"

### Help Save Lives at St Margaret's!



Many patients walk or need to be carried for several days to reach St Margaret's Hospital at Oro Bay in the Diocese of Popondota. They often arrive only to be disappointed when they learn that they cannot be treated there. They then journey another 50 km to

Popondetta General Hospital. This situation means that around 4,500 patients end up at Popondetta General Hospital every year—a hospital already crowded with patients.

Many patients in and around the area die of preventable or curable conditions, and the Anglican Board of Mission is assisting the Anglican Church in PNG to upgrade St Margaret's from a rural health clinic to a fully functioning hospital.

A report in April says that construction for its upgrading has begun and is progressing well, but many more resources are needed, especially new equipment. The Royal Australian College of Surgeons has offered to contribute some equipment. An operating theatre is planned, and delivery rooms and maternity wards.

The quality of water available is of concern, as is sanitation. New toilets are being installed to save patients the often painstaking walk to the pit toilets several hundred metres away.

It was decided by the Pastoral District Council that any money donated on ABM Sunday (celebrated this year in Southern Vales on 3rd October) would be sent to the upgrading of St Margaret's Hospital. The Diocese of Popondota, in which the hospital is situated, signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Diocese of The Murray in 2007 and traditionally Southern Vales directs some of its ABM donation to work in that Diocese.

Your used stamps can make money for ABM! Collect them and give them to your Wardens to pass on.



# New Life in the Church at Wickham, northern WA.

In February the parish was given the use of a hall, which led to a special celebration to launch the Wickham Community Church. (Wickham

had been without a minister for over 10 years.) There are efforts now to develop a ministry for the whole of the town in the form of a Community Chaplain. Rio Tinto is being very helpful and feel there is a need also at the mine site. The minister has been contacted by the Principal of the local primary school, too, regarding a school chaplaincy.

A "wise man from the east" has offered his support to establish a church building. He builds rammed earth or mud bricks which are ideal for the climate and cheap to build, and the locals can be involved in the construction. (Brings back memories of building the St Ann's hall!)
