Granny Annie's meets with Anglicare

On 22nd May a group of volunteers from Granny Annie's drop-in centre had an inspiring meeting with Peter Burke (Pastoral Care & Parish Development Manager) and Jill Rivers (Parish Community Engagement Worker) from Anglicare, talking about "Granny Annie's" and other matters of parish outreach in our rapidly growing region. As Fr Paul pointed out, Aldinga is the fastest growing area in South Australia.

Peter and Jill affirmed the value they saw in Granny Annie's: while numbers attending are not large, smaller numbers allow for deeper quality of interaction, support and discussion. They shared experiences of other outreach activities undertaken by some parishes in the Province, and their ways of "being church", and offered encouragement to reach out to find out the needs of our community, to be open to where the Spirit might move us. What skills are we growing that we could use? What do the children teach us about the needs of the community? Are there older people being supported in independent living who are desperately lonely? We gain as much as we give; are



there others in the community who could be involved? Other activities we might think of might involve craft, or singing. People drive past and see the building—but how do we put a "human face" on the church?

2013 Synod Report

The Second Session of the fifteenth Triennial Synod of the Diocese of The Murray commenced with a Holy Eucharist in the Church of St Luke, Tailem Bend at 4.00 pm on Friday May 24th. The liturgy was An Order for Holy Communion (2009), a revision of An Alternate Order of Holy Communion, issued earlier for 'trial use' by the Liturgy Commission. The Great Thanksgiving Prayer was based on the most ancient known full text, attributed to Hipploytus (c.200), from a fresh translation by the Revd Dr Evan Burge. The business of Synod commenced at 5.30 pm in the Tailem Bend Town Hall. The Administrator, Fr Richard Seabrook opened the meeting with prayer and followed with a Presidential Address. In His address Fr Richard expressed his frustration that he has not been able to announce the appointment of a new Bishop of The Murray but explained that such appointments are confidential until an announcement can be made. He recognised that rumours have been circulating; some are spurious but plain wrong. Under Standing Orders the Report of the Diocesan Council was presented by the Registrar and received by Synod. The Notice Paper was called over and several motions including the Budget and Rate of Assessment were passed without discussion. Friday evening covered financial matters and reports of Synod organisations. Synod adjourned at 7.00 pm and members of Synod travelled to Murray Bridge for a Synod Dinner, a Chinese Banquet. This social gathering was much appreciated by members of Synod. Synod recommenced on Saturday morning at 9.00am with voting for The Bishop Election Committee. Brian McMillan was elected a Lay Member and Fr Dirk van Dissel as a Clergy Member. The remainder of the motions were discussed and voted on. A few motions were withdrawn or amended with advice from the President, Fr Richard Seabrook or the new Chancellor, Dr Robert Tong. While it was pointed out that a few motions were the province of a Diocesan Bishop, the discussion that ensued was thought useful by some Synod members. After some of the submitted questions were answered and then various people thanked for their organisation and service, the Synod meeting closed after lunch at about 1.45 pm. Ted Sandercock

Fr Paul writes...

Relationships are important, all those we relate to in our families, our Church, our workplace, and our friends. Unfortunately for many people their relationship with God is not so paramount. We see this by the number of activities that people attend to now on Sunday besides going to church. For me, that was in my life before becoming an ordained deacon and priest; going to church Sunday by Sunday was essential in maintaining my relationship with God, in spiritually being refreshed through the consecrated bread and wine, in hearing and reflecting on His word and being with God in prayer and in worship. I actually missed it if I was not able to attend a Sunday service when away.

Besides making the regular commitment to go to church, the gift of the Holy Spirit given to us at our baptism and reaffirmed at our confirmation helps us and is our guide day by day. We have recently celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit through the festival of Pentecost. This is when, after Jesus had ascended into heaven, the Holy Spirit descended on all the believers in a room in Jerusalem. There people were given various gifts and some started speaking in other languages. You can find the account of this in Acts Chapter 2. The Holy Spirit is not just a force or an influence but is the third person of the Trinity; God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Jesus, before he died on the Cross and rose again, spoke of the helper, the Holy Spirit, that would "teach you everything and make you remember all that I have told you' (John 14.26).

The Holy Spirit is the life giving Spirit and is at work in human beings. It gives us wisdom to see things as God sees them, it gives us understanding of God's revelation to us, it gives us counsel to help us see what we should do in difficult situations and it gives us inward strength to do God's will.

We have just started the season of Pentecost (Trinity). It is a time of growth in all of us as Christians, and as a result, I wear green vestments for the next few months. May God allow the Holy Spirit to grow in us during this time, as we worship and come together as a community of faith in Christ, hopefully Sunday by Sunday!

If you are not baptised and would like receive the Holy Spirit as a gift of God to you, please contact me. Also it's not too late if you wish to be confirmed. Confirmation classes have started but I would welcome any others who wish to reaffirm for themselves their baptismal vows.

A special thank you also to the fundraising committee for organising the dinners at the McLaren Flat Community Club. The next one will be held on Friday 14th June. I hope you will be able to support this dinner and join in for fellowship with the local community.

Pastoral Care Group Meeting, St Margaret's 30th April

The meeting began with prayer and a Bible study reflecting on Jesus being the Good Shepherd, based on John Ch. 10. Fr Paul spoke of what pastoral care is, believing it is a vital part of life as a Christian community. He explained that the formation of the pastoral care group in the Pastoral District of the Southern Vales is a recommendation of the Outreach Committee, part of a five year plan.

Fr Paul also explained new protocols for those involved in pastoral care in the name of the church. Not only will those involved have had to undertake the safer ministry program but also now will need to undergo a police check and to fill out a safer ministry questionnaire.


Fr. Paul suggested a number of areas where the pastoral care group could help him. He believed these included keeping in touch with the sick and or those not well enough or unable to attend church any more, and following up those who have not been to church for some time or are new attendees.

Fr Paul thanked Greg Roberts for providing Home Communions to the elderly, and was eager for this to continue as part of the work of this pastoral care group. Trish Frith also was able to perform this ministry. As a part of visitation, there is an opportunity for prayerful support.

A training workshop was suggested. Sarndra Saunders offered to run such a course, given her experience with Anglicare and Lifeline. A paper from the Diocese of Tasmania given at a Ministry Conference in Hobart in 2012 was handed out. The paper, "Pastoral Care: The Essentials", provided "dos and don'ts" of pastoral care.

The year to date deficit is \$6,722 (approx. \$4,200 less than budget forecast) and both income and expenditure were under budget predictions. Thank you Margaret!



Christian Care & Support Centre


Thank you to the people of the Southern Vales Pastoral District for your continued support of food donated to the centre.

News from St Stephen's, Willunga

Willunga 175: St Stephen's will participate in the Willunga 175 celebration, 2014. Suggestions include:

- * Commemoration Service (early in the year?) based on 1662 liturgy (Evensong?) with hymns by the Wesleys? Clergy and servers dressed appropriately for the 1850s.
- * Display in the church during History Week/ Month 2014 - open on more than one occasion?
- * Art Show (theme to be decided) over at least one weekend (midyear?)
- * Hymnfest popular hymns of the late 1800s & early 1900s with historical background (composers and lyricists) of each chosen hymn. September or October? We could also make the church available for other suitable activities if requested by the Willunga 175 committee.
