#### The console comes home!

The late Greg Trott (1934 – 2005), who was People's Warden at St Margaret's for 24 years, had a dream of installing a pipe organ at his Wirra Wirra winery. He purchased the remains of the organ at Crafers Church of the Epiphany in 1995, and was having it rebuilt by Adelaide organ builder Leith Jacob.

Since Greg's death, the organ has been languishing in a shipping container, the project unfinished. With the encouragement of Greg John, Performing Arts Coordinator at Tatachilla Lutheran College, a group of local musicians and organ lovers has formed Friends of the Greg Trott Pipe Organ Inc. with the aim of caring for the instrument and having it installed somewhere in the district when a suitable building is available.

Until that time, the brand new console, made of Western Australian Karri from Trott's collection of 16' wine casks, will be rewired and operate as a "virtual organ" for services and concerts at St Margaret's. How appropriate for it to come to Greg's old church.

The committee anticipates that an inaugural concert can be held in a few months to launch the society and begin fund-raising. With a modern computer inside, the best organ software and a suitable sound system, the organ will sound and operate as closely as possible to the real thing.

The committee is still looking for a suitably cool place to store the remaining parts of the organ (pipes, blowers, casework), either in the 20' container, or in a space that can hold about 30 cubic metres. Greg John







# Fr Paul writes...

In opening up a bank account or requiring a police check, you need proper identification adding up to 100 points. It can be quite a process, unless you have a passport, in which case you automatically have all the points required. In Jesus' time, a police check was not required, not that I am aware of, anyway. Jesus knew who he was, the Son of God, and spent much time in prayer with His heavenly Father. In Luke Chapter 9 v.18, Jesus after praying asks his disciples who he is. The disciples compare him to the great and holy men they know, and answer that maybe he is John the Baptist, or Elijah, one of the prophets in the Old Testament who had risen again. Eventually Peter takes a deep breath and answers, naming him the "Messiah of God."

The question posed to the disciples by Jesus two thousand years ago hasn't changed much. It is a question that we, as disciples of Jesus, also have to answer – not just on one day, but repeatedly, continually, in our everyday lives. The Church that Jesus came from heaven to earth to establish is comprised of all those who like St Peter believe and confess that Christ is the "Messiah, the Son of the Living God."

The reality of who Christ is – the Son of God – is also the foundation of who we are. As St Paul says in Galatians Chapter 3 v.26-27, "In Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, as many of you were baptised into Christ." Just as Jesus' identity is found in his relationship to his Father – Jesus is the Son of the Living God – so our most profound identity is discovered in our relationship to the same Father. Jesus came to us to reveal the love of the Father for us and to bring us into that communion of love.

The better we understand our relationship with God the Father, the better we will know our identity. So let us allow Jesus, who came to reveal the Father to us, to reintroduce him to us today, so that we might experience his deep love more fully, and love him in return much more intensely. Following the Lord throughout the journey of our life is a wonderful thing. So many people don't know where they are going and so many don't know which direction their lives should take. We Christians are lucky; we follow the Lord. How glad we should be, in a world that is becoming increasingly more lost, that we are the flock of the Lord and that we follow Him.

#### From St Stephen's, Willunga



- An application for restoration activities as suggested by Environmental Architect, Andrew Stevens, has received a heritage grant of \$2,000 from City of Onkaparinga Heritage Branch. This has been accepted. The total cost of the repairs is about \$7,000.
- Repair work by the stonemason and the painter has commenced. The front door looks great in the grey-green heritage colour. The newly painted door has had all the 1960s additions removed—fake hinges and door handles or rings.


