# Organ recital at St Margaret's, McLaren Vale Sunday 24th November, 2.30 pm

In 1995, the late Greg Trott of McLaren Vale, a Warden of St Margaret's for many years, purchased a fine 3 manual, 40-stop English Romantic organ from Crafers Church of the Epiphany, and set about having it rebuilt for his Wirra Wirra winery. The organ, which included a beautiful new console made from wine-barrel jarrah, has been in limbo since Greg's death in 2005, stored in a 20 foot shipping container.

"Friends of the Greg Trott Pipe Organ Inc." has been formed with the ultimate objective of installing it somewhere in the McLaren Vale region for the benefit of the whole community. The organ, without pipes as yet, is at present in Greg Trott's old church, St Margaret's, and is being reconfigured as a "virtual pipe organ", using modern computer software and sampling techniques to make the operation and sound of the instrument as close as possible to the real thing.

The first public performance of the organ will be on 24th November, when a Greg Trott Organ Fund will be launched. There will be no charge for attendance, but there will be an afternoon tea to follow, so for catering purposes please contact Rosemary Nairn <a href="mailto:rnairn@ozemail.com.au">rnairn@ozemail.com.au</a> or 0419 832 187 if you would like to come. Future concerts will be fundraisers for the Greg Trott Organ Fund and our Pastoral District.

Guest organist on the day will be Senior Organ Scholar at St Peter's Cathedral, Alexander Paine, who will play a number of pieces to show off the organ's capabilities. Some of our local organists will also play, and the audience can enjoy singing some famous hymns to the glorious accompaniment of a grand pipe organ.





# Fr Paul writes...

I am sure many of you are considering plans for this Christmas with family and friends. I hope those plans include the very reason why we mark this time of the year, and that is celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ 2000 years ago. We should spiritually prepare ourselves for this celebration, just as we prepare for any celebration.

The Four Sundays of Advent leading up to Christmas recall the history of God's people and reflect on how the prophecies and promises of the Old Testament were fulfilled. The meaning of the word Advent is 'coming'. Here we prepare for the Lord coming in a manger, in becoming one of us as a human being.

There are numerous ways in which we can prepare ourselves for Christmas, besides buying presents and the turkey. In preparing ourselves spiritually, I encourage you to take the time out to attend our Sunday services and also to attend our Advent studies. The study this year is called "Expecting Christ". The course is spread over four weeks starting later this month. It will enable us to think about how Jesus Christ can surprise us and meet us in distinct contexts (see p. 2). The course will be run at the Rectory at McLaren Vale at 10 am on Wednesdays and 7.30 pm on Thursdays.

A disturbing aspect of this coming Christmas for me as we prepare to celebrate it is the number of people who have been displaced through civil war, and with it, the persecution of Christians. The civil war in Syria has seen 600,000 Christians leave the country. It is estimated that 600 have been martyred for their faith. The future for those who remain appears bleak. The number of safe places for the remaining 1.4 million Christians is running out and we need to pray that Christians in Syria will know that no matter how desperate their situation becomes, God will be their help. We need to pray for a peaceful outcome to the conflict, that will not further marginalise or endanger them.

There are various appeals that are helping Christians in Syria. The Anglican Board of Mission is running an emergency appeal in association with the Anglican Alliance. See <a href="www.abmission.org">www.abmission.org</a> The Aid Agency of the persecuted Church, Barnabas Aid, is also helping. More than two million dollars has been given to help displaced and suffering Christians in Syria. More information about the Barnabas Fund can be found by visiting <a href="www.barnabasfund.org.au">www.barnabasfund.org.au</a> or phoning 1300 365 799. Its address is PO Box 3527, Loganholme, Queensland, 4129.

The National Council of Churches also has a Syria Crisis Appeal. There should be envelopes at the back of our churches to donate to this appeal. If you are wondering what to give someone this Christmas, why not consider giving a donation to one of these church agencies on their behalf?

# News from Pastoral District Council

On Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> October, after a shared meal, the Council met at 6.45 pm chaired by Canon Dirk. Matters discussed included the following. Other items appear elsewhere in this edition.

#### Solar panels at St Margaret's

Fr Paul has given the go ahead to Aldinga Bay Electrical and they have dropped the price by \$200 to \$4,800 plus GST and the meter upgrade. The application to SA Power Networks was approved the same day. They need a 50% deposit for work to proceed and installation must be complete by the end of the year. Margaret Cale is arranging to transfer funds from the Special Purpose Fund to cover the deposit.

#### Installation of new rented printer/photocopier

The new machine is making a huge difference in efficiency and modern enhancements. Anne Chittleborough and Ted Sandercock were able to print *The Grapevine* for October in 1 hour 25 minutes plus folding and labeling and without insertion of pages.

#### Fence on northern boundary at St Margaret's

Mr Dave Bennett had written another letter with an offer to pay in full for a new fence, planting and maintenance of vines. After further discussion his proposal was again rejected as the current fence is considered adequate and suitable for St Margaret's land - a letter to be sent with this final decision.

#### St Ann's Restoration work

Bill Cale has contacted the painters who are ready to start work soon but are waiting for a window replacement.

#### **Gregg Trott Pipe Organ project at St Margaret's:** (see also p. 1)

Invitations have been sent out for the launch on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> November and it is hoped that the church will be full. There will be no charge as it is a launch but there will be a charge for subsequent concerts. Fr Paul is still seeking an undercover home for the container. Greg Trott's daughters will donate the organ to the committee and after that insurance will be taken out. They are still awaiting tax deductibility of the fund to be approved. In the meantime the Registrar has advised that the church is not responsible for the organ's insurance and Brian McMillan believes that the church is only liable if we are seen to be negligent. Paul Bell and John Carroll are keeping the grass under control to reduce fire risk.

#### **Rectory inspection**

This was carried out by Greg Roberts and Joe Saunders with Fr Paul. New fly wire has been attached to the rear screen door, gutter cleaning and internal painting were noted and Joe Saunders has offered to attend to revarnishing of the front door, similar to his work on the verandah seat. Thank you Joe.

**Advent Pageant** The Pageant is now being organized by Graham Benger. The Committee passed a motion of thanks to Anne for her past planning and work for this outreach event.

**Correspondence**: In response to letters received, the PDC approved donations of \$100 towards the Advent Pageant and \$200 to the McLaren Vale Community Carols at Tatachilla College.

A letter was received from Bp Stanley regretfully advising that he feels he can no longer take services\*.
