


the church, under the trees, crocuses had burst into flower—a symbol of new life?




GOOD FRIDAY



Over the past six weeks a committee consisting of Brian McMillan, Pat Roper, Margaret Cale, Ted and Wendy Sandercock, Bob & Susan Smith, Greg & Leonie Pettman and Anne Chittleborough worked to produce a "4x4 audit" of our pastoral district and community to present to the Bishop as part of our involvement in the diocesan "Taking the Plunge Together" programme.

The audit involved mapping the pastoral district, showing where the congregations of our four churches actually live, and pinpointing the locations where people congregate for community activities, including shopping centres, schools and other community and sporting clubs. It included population statistics for our local government area and a breakdown of age groupings. (Copies of the map and audit are available at each church.)

Audits including ours were presented to the Bishop by representatives of the parish and pastoral districts at a service at the Cathedral on Maundy Thursday. Brian McMillan and Pat Roper represented our pastoral district.

The audits will be used to formulate a mission action plan for each of the parishes and pastoral districts.



"... Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect... as in one body we have many members, and all the members do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; he who teaches, in his teaching; he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who contributes, in liberality; he who gives aid, with zeal; he who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness."

During his reflection, the Bishop also commended the *Following Jesus* program which is to start after Pentecost. The program will involve a series of Bible studies either in 24 weekly sessions or over eight full days in the second half of the year. "As a diocese and as people faithful to the Good News," he said, "we acknowledge that each of us has an extremely important role in growing God's Church. Each and every person in the Diocese of the Murray has been blessed with numerous gifts, talents and skills for the building of the Kingdom here on earth. In our **Taking the Plunge Together** diocesan programme we as a people committed to mission and ministry recognise that both laity and clergy working together are vital for the future of our diocese – God's Church. I take this opportunity to thank you for the work you have completed to date and for your continued support of our **Taking the Plunge Together** mission.

The results of the diocese-wide audits will be collated by the Bishop and a visiting priest, Father Damien Feeney who will meet with each of the Parishes and the pastoral districts during May to help start formulating the mission action plan.

The meeting for the Southern Vales will be at Christ Church, O'Halloran Hill at 3.15 pm on Tuesday 13th of May.

All are welcome, and everyone is encouraged to attend.

Fr Paul writes...

A Happy Easter to you all. It was wonderful to be able to share with you the celebration of Easter at our four churches. There were many visitors, some from Sydney and Melbourne, who either spoke to me afterwards or contacted me directly or indirectly, saying how much they enjoyed the worship. Thank you to everyone who helped in some way in making Holy Week such a success.

We have various gospel readings at this time on the presence of Jesus with his disciples and others after his resurrection. Last Sunday, we heard of the disciple Thomas who was not with the rest of the disciples when Jesus appeared to them on the day of his resurrection. Thomas could not believe that Jesus had risen from the dead and demanded proof. Jesus appeared again to Thomas a week later along with the rest of the disciples, firstly with a greeting of peace. There, Jesus was able to reassure Thomas that he was risen. Having overcome his crisis of doubt, Thomas became one of the greatest missionaries of the early Church. He took the Gospel to Persia, Syria and India.

We have other readings over the season of Easter related to the other disciples going out into the world to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. Last Sunday, Peter in his first letter wrote to the people of Asia Minor. The people had not seen Jesus Christ physically but were being encouraged in their faith. Peter was recognised as the leader and founder of the Church who had been given full authority from Jesus through the Holy Spirit to serve him as an apostle. Even though we can't touch Jesus Christ physically, we can draw to him spiritually and in faith too. We see God working through the Holy Spirit in people's lives daily. Jesus invites us as pilgrims on this earth to make the Son of God 'visible' in the world. That was the way for the first disciples: so it should be for us.

The Diocesan program "Taking the Plunge Together" is aimed at just this. The audit of the Pastoral District of the Southern Vales has been completed, giving us a good idea of the population statistics of the area and the age categories in the towns in which we live, and of our congregations and where the community centres are. The next stage will be the development of a mission action plan. A meeting will be held with the audit team and any others who wish to attend at Christ Church, O'Halloran Hill on Tuesday the 13th of May at 3.15 pm, to meet with the Bishop and a visiting priest, Fr Damien Feeney. In the second half of the year, there will be a study program titled "Following Jesus" for all to be involved in. More details on this later. This will help us to equip ourselves to evangelise and spread the good news just as the disciples did. May we deserve to be numbered with those whom Jesus declared blessed, namely, "those who have not seen and yet have believed." John 20:29.

The building has been moving/cracking ever since. The most recent remedial action using deep soil irrigation and a chemical damp course for the Tower and south wall are showing promise. The April meeting was held at St Margaret's on 22nd April, chaired by Fr Paul. Among matters raised were those below. Other matters appear elsewhere in this issue.

NBN connection: The copper line to the office was cut during installation and there is still no connection to it. The phone & PC in the Rectory are working well on NBN. As only one free optic fibre connection is made to each address, and St Margaret's has an office as well as a rectory, it is planned to use wireless connection to the office, allowing internet access there as well as in the Rectory. The change to line is still in process.

Publicity and media: A committee has been formed, consisting of Fr Paul, Ted Sandercock, Susan Smith and Paul Zimmerman, and has been looking at how we involve ourselves with others, especially through electronic media. Consideration to be given to updating the website and making it more user-friendly. Fr Paul was thanked for updating it weekly. There is also now a PD facebook. A monthly article is contributed by Ted to the Willunga Gazette.

Taking the Plunge: The 4x4 audit (see p. 5). Fr Paul thanked members of the TTPT committee who had worked on the audit for their eager involvement.

Wedding Expo, 29th **June, Serafino winery:** Fr Paul reported that our attendance at the expo was free, and that 1,000—1,500 people visit it. A number of wedding celebrants are present: it is important for the church to be represented even though few show interest in a church wedding.

The **Fundraising Committee** reported that Helen Roberts was no longer able to continue as co-ordinator of the monthly Community Club dinners, and it was believed that we did not have the experience, numbers or confidence to continue without her. These dinners had been a source of income and an outreach opportunity. Helen and Greg were thanked for their work over past months. Other fundraising opportunities were being discussed.

At the 2014 Vestry meeting those present were asked to vote on which of the Anglican Board of Mission's programmes they would like to support in 2014. Results were close, indicating that people saw the value of many of the different programmes. The two winners were: Disaster Risk Reduction and Building Local Skills: Assistance to Anglican Schools (PNG).

ABM's Disaster Risk Reduction Programme.



The Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and New Caledonia lie within the "Ring of Fire" area, where earthquakes, tsunamis and volcanic eruptions are prevalent, and loss of life and loss of homes and livelihoods occur such as were experienced at Tumotu in February 2014. The Anglican Church of Melanesia is creating a Disaster Action Plan to prepare the people of its islands to survive disasters like these.

Rising sea levels due to climate change are causing islands to "sink". ABM is involved in assisting the church's plan for resettlement of sinking atoll islands such as Ontong Java & Sikaiana.

This year ABM will also be supporting disaster risk reduction work in South Sudan.

Building Local Skills: Assistance to Anglican Schools (PNG)

With 40% of people over 15 in Papua New Guinea being illiterate, ABM supports adult literacy schools in rural areas in the diocese of Aipo Rongo and Dogura. Many of those attending are women. They also receive training in organising social and economic activities in their community. In 2014 they will be encouraged to use their new skills to assist their income generation.

In addition to this work, ABM is supporting the PNG Anglican Church's programme to hold conferences in each diocese to enable school principals, teachers and administrators to meet and work on how they can improve the governance of their schools and improve the education services provided.
