## ***Val Martin, R. J. P.***

With the death of Val Martin on 24<sup>th</sup> June our Pastoral District has lost one of its special people. Warm-hearted, generous, fun-loving Val, maker of scones and mischief, first in to offer when something needed to be done, Val will be very much missed by her family, her friends, St Ann's congregation and beyond.

Val was born and grew up in Goroke, Victoria, and married stock & station agent Bushy Martin. When they came to live in Willunga and later Aldinga, they became staunch members of our church, and played a pivotal role in the fundraising and building of St Ann's hall, with stones donated and collected from their farm on the hill.

Val served at times as President of the Guild and Sacristan at St Ann's, and was always "in there" in times of need.

Warden Peter Chapman, speaking at morning tea on the Sunday after the funeral, concluded: "There is a lot of Val in that hall, perhaps more than sweat and tears... I encourage you if you're missing Val to go to the hall and put your hand on a stone—it might have been one of the many she laid in the mortar— and think of the good times we shared with her. Dear Val; much of St Ann's involved many stones over many years. You became one of them, a real rock, and now you are with the Chief Corner Stone."

## *Fr Paul writes...*

A fellow priest of mine who attended St Philip and St James', Old Noarlunga on the last Sunday of June reminded me after the service of the words used in the first hymn sung that morning. The hymn titled "Trust and Obey" states in the last three lines of the final verse "What he says we will do, where he sends we will go – never fear, only trust and obey."

They were very apt words at my last Eucharist at St Philip and St James' as Priest Assistant of the Southern Vales. As you may be aware, I complete my role as Priest Assistant later this month in the Southern Vales and begin a new role as the Parish Priest for the Riverland. My last service will be the St Ann's Patronal Festival on July the 20<sup>th</sup>, to which you are all very welcome.

Of course, it was a very difficult decision for Helen and me to accept the Bishop's offer to go to The Riverland. I had informed the Bishop late last year that I had wanted to become the Parish Priest in the Southern Vales and to continue to develop the vision plan adopted four years ago for this area. However, the Bishop had other ideas. I felt positive about the move to the Riverland when the offer was made, but it was one that Helen and I had to work through over nearly three months before we finally agreed to accept the Bishop's offer.

In a second discussion with the Bishop during this process of making a decision, the Bishop made the comment that it was not between both of us to accept this position, but between God and me. This made me only work harder in prayer in affirming this is what God desired of me in my next phase of my ministry as a priest. I also sought spiritual guidance from two other priests to make sure that this was the right decision. I with confidence then accepted the Bishop's offer.

There have been several times in my life when critical decisions have had to be made. I realise that God has been with me during those times and continues to work through me as I walk with the Lord doing his will. Hence the last lines of the famous hymn "Trust and Obey": "where he sends we will go – never fear, only trust and obey".

I will certainly miss you all and the opportunity to become part of your lives as I have over the past five years as part of my formation for 12 months as a deacon, and as your priest assistant for nearly four years.

Several retired priests have agreed to help out for two months or so until Fr Nick Schutt arrives in October for a two month locum. Please support them as they continue to provide a weekly ministry in the Southern Vales.

Please also support seven candidates who will be confirmed by Bishop John Ford at St. Margaret's on July the 13<sup>th</sup> at 10 am.

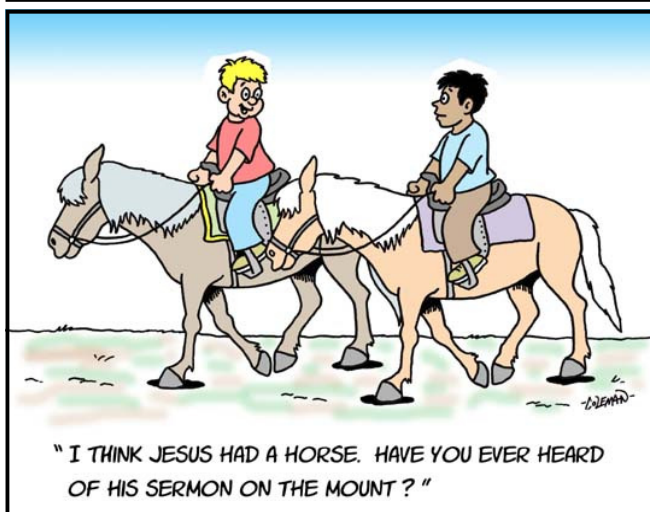

We are always grateful to these "behind the scenes" workers who make sure things look good and run smoothly.

We have begun the *Following Jesus* programme with ten in the St Margaret's group and we are happy for more to join us. It promises to be a challenging and very encouraging course. It runs at 10 am on Wednesday mornings.

## News from Pastoral District Council

On Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June the Council met at 7.00 pm chaired by Fr Paul. Matters discussed included the following. Other items appear elsewhere in this edition.

**NBN Connection.** There is now a new phone handset in the Parish Office with wireless connection to a new handset in the rectory. This means there are two handsets in the Rectory Study, one for the Rectory and one with wireless extension to the Parish Office - a very good outcome after the hassles following the accidental cutting of the copper line to the office during the NBN installation. We now have the option of internet connection in the office if a new computer is purchased with a wireless card. With the second connection the monthly cost with iiNet is \$79.95, an increase of \$10 per month. After Fr Paul leaves we will still pay \$79.90 per month for the internet and two phones. Arrangements will be in place for an answering machine in the Rectory which will need to be checked when the rectory is unoccupied.

**Wedding Expo** 29<sup>th</sup> June: Fr Paul & Helen, Andrew & Dawn Parker and Helen & Greg Roberts assisted.

**Appointment of PD Treasurer:** The Pastoral District is still seeking a Treasurer. Margaret Cale has been continuing in the role temporarily despite having officially retired. We give heartfelt thanks for her dedication.

**Fr Paul and Helen's move to The Riverland:** Fr Paul confirmed that his last Sunday with us will be 20<sup>th</sup> July, his commissioning will be on 9<sup>th</sup> August at 11 am at Waikerie which is the closest church to the PD of Southern Vales and 2¾ hours from McLaren Vale. Fr Paul has been speaking to Brian McMillan re music for the commissioning and the choir. There will be lunch at the Waikerie Community Club afterwards - 200 people are expected including an estimated 20-30 from our pastoral district. Removalists will be at the rectory on 23<sup>rd</sup> July. A locum, Fr Nick Shutt, will be here for October and November and Fr John and Fr Ed will help fill in the gaps. Some Sundays still need to be filled in. In the case of funerals English Rose will contact Fr John, Fr Graham and another priest to be decided. Fr Nick will be happy to take Saturday night services and two services on Sundays. His first service will be on 5<sup>th</sup> October, a Family Service.

**Following Jesus program:** The sessions held so far were considered very thought-provoking with a suggestion to do it little by little during the week as it is difficult to do all at once. The comment was made that "Some people don't talk, just listen and think and then come up with an amazing contribution."

**Comments:** Margaret Cale, Retired Treasurer, commented that:

- \* The monthly deficit includes the monthly insurance payment which will continue until October (as it is paid over 10 months) so we are seeing the impact monthly.
- \* January to May collections are within \$500 of an ambitious budget figure.
- \* Following the letter from the Diocese after Vestry, Margaret Cale presented the Pastoral District's Special Purpose Fund accounts with explanations.
- \* She has set up a different separate set of accounts as, with the accounting set up through the Balance Sheet, there was insufficient detail for the Diocese.
- \* These consist of:
  - a separate Profit & Loss Statement listing the Guilds and each R&M account from January to May 2014 and
  - a separate Account Transactions showing each individual transaction.
- \* Money received for R&M needs to be shown where it is from on the weekly Collections sheet, eg Bottles and cans, donations.
- \* It gives each centre the chance to see the money going in and out of the accounts.

Fr Paul thanked Margaret for doing the extra work. Since the Council meeting, followed by an R&M meeting, Margaret has been working with the Diocese on a document showing a clear outline of the new procedure for R&M expenditure to ensure timely payment of accounts.
