



# The need is so great...

Extracts from the AGM report of the Chairman of the Christian Community Centre, Aldinga:

The demand for support is still on the increase and the resources to deliver are in the decline and harder to access. If it were not for the generous support of our local church congregations and the team of volunteers who are always on hand to work, pick up bread etc. we would not be able to continue. Our costs are relatively low being essentially insurance and room rental. Our main source of income is from the government grant that in 2014 (July to December) has continued at the reduced rate of 2012 and 2013, despite the increase in demand.

The number of people seeking support is increasing all the time and the extent of their need has increased as water and electricity costs in particular rise. As a result of our income remaining essentially the same we have had to reduce the amount of support which causes a degree of frustration from both clients and volunteers who appreciate the dire need some of the families are in.

At this stage we are awaiting the outcome of our application for a new grant. If it comes through then we will be fine but if not we will have to consider other options.

We thank God for his continuing blessings on our group and trust that he will support us in our outreach work in this community.

# News from Pastoral District Council

The September meeting of the Pastoral District Council was held on Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September, chaired by Ted Sandercock, with Bishop John Ford in attendance for part of the meeting. Matters discussed included the following (other items are covered elsewhere in this issue):

A replacement for the **PD Treasurer** has not yet been found. The Bishop reported that this was a difficulty faced by parishes and PDs in many parts of the diocese and it may be necessary to centralise the work.

The **Mission Action Plan** group had met and lots of ideas shared. Involvement in the Aldinga Advent Pageant (see p. 5) was planned, and possible participation in the Aldinga Christmas Pageant.

**Rectory Maintenance**: Thanks to Ted and Wendy for all they have done. Household supplies were being provided by St Ann's and St Margaret's, with furniture and a TV on loan. The Droughts were lending a car. Bishop John asked if Southern Vales would provide accommodation for visiting bishops in the first 5 months of 2015, as we are not likely to have a priest here before Easter. The visitors would be here on diocesan business but would take Sunday services.

Fr Ed would not be able to continue to take services. **Petrol vouchers** to be given to him and to Fr Graham. They had not asked for payment for services taken.

Bishop John discussed the **process of appointing a new priest** to our Pastoral District, and gave an assurance that he would work with us in an "open government" process. He applauded the parish profile put together by the committee, and talked through some of the factors that would influence a priest's decision to take up the appointment. These



included the PD's website, the parish profile, factors such as the availability of schools (for a young married man), work opportunities in the area (which older children might look for), the kind of involvement we as lay people would like to have, things we would like a priest to help us with, the diocesan move to encourage clergy in the archdeaconries to support each other and share their ministry. A web address could show the attractions of the Fleurieu Peninsula. When the Profile had been finalised the Bishop would send it to all dioceses in Australia and consider other advertising options. When the bishop left, the council thanked him for his attendance and

input, for his inclusion of the observers in the discussion, and his approach in treating us in the same way as a parish.

Margaret Cale stated that it had been an horrific month – mainly due to the leave entitlements for Fr Paul. Hopefully we would be able to consolidate over the next couple of months when most of the current commitments would be cleared. Attendances had been down, probably due to holidays and sickness ,and giving was down by \$1,720 on budget.

**Deputy PD Council member** In Peter Chapman's absence the bishop would be happy to make an appointment.

**Fire extinguishers** have been replaced as they were 5 years old and needed testing, which would have been an expensive exercise. It had been expensive to do all at the one time and it would be better to stagger them.

We have a shortage of licensed **Eucharistic Assistants** to assist the priests and administer the chalice at the Eucharist. Priests' assistance can also be offered by servers, who do not need to be licensed, and do not administer the chalice.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday the 21st of October at 7pm at St Margaret's, chaired by Fr Nick Shutt.
