

### Elizabeth Blades, R.J.P.



Wife of Fr Jim Blades, whose ashes were interred at St Ann's recently, Elizabeth was a vital part of our Southern Vales church community for many years. Among other ministries she and Fr Jim had spent five years in the Solomon Islands, then served at Seacliff 1974-1989 before retiring to Aldinga. With a strong commitment to outreach and care, Elizabeth was involved with Eileen Binns and Sue Armstrong in setting up a Young Mums group in the '90s for mothers and small children, and she and Fr Jim were among the group who established the Christian Care & Community Centre at Aldinga. Practical, spirit-filled, fun-filled, musical, artistic, Elizabeth made her mark on the parish in so many ways. Organist at St Ann's for many years, she set up some wonderful concerts with her daughters. She was a tireless worker in building St Ann's hall, and also created its memorial window, and painted the builders. (Also, in a moment of levity, the face we hide behind the curtain!) In 2006 the

Blades moved to Perth to be with children David, Mary-Ann & Margaret, but always kept in touch with St Ann's.

## 50 years of Service – Trish Frith

President of the Southern Vales Branch of the Mothers' Union, Trish was awarded a certificate at the Lady Day service, St Peter's Cathedral, Adelaide, by Australian MU President, The Rev'd Canon Libbie Crossman (see photo below).



As a young wife in Booval, Qld, Trish was admitted as a member of MU in 1965. With family far away the RAAF and Church became their family. Postings

included Werribee and Laverton in Victoria. By 1969 they had 4 children under 5 and when her husband Ken accepted a task in the Antarctic for 15 months, Trish and the children returned to Blackwood, SA. By 1974 a posting to Pearce, WA saw an exciting change-living on the Base and enjoying ecumenical church services in a Nissan Hut! Their move to Willunga in about 1979 saw retirement from air force life and a new path discovering life on an almond orchard. Sadly, Ken died in 2001.

Through MU the Anglican Church in our pastoral district started a Young Wives group, where Trish had a great time with activities with the children. Today she is involved with a wide range of community activities as well as the church, where she is a Eucharistic Assistant, chairs St Ann's Guild, gardens at St Ann's, and is well-known as a rose pruner extraordinaire. #### **Easter Sunday**

#### Anglican Church of St Ann, Aldinga, 1985

The little church is bare and white save for the Easter lilies' bright shock of pink and the gold encrusting the altar cloth. Morning sun streams in from the north, washing like a gift of grace over the left side of each face. The country parish is too poor for stained glass, so the light is clear as water. We kneel for the bread and wine, lulled by the muted organ tone and the rhythmic offering of the cup the pause, the quiet words, the token wipe of the rim. A ceaseless shrill of birds floods in from the wattle trees outside. It is accomplished, calmly as is meet and proper, the melting wafer sweet on the tongue; but as the final hymn begins a twelve-year-old, the simple one, cries out and runs to the rail and lifts his unfilled hands and empty face. The congregation stands. The priest, for a moment, hesitates and then comes to him with the bread and wine: a ripple in the singing tide makes more elbow-room for God.

#### Vestry!

Vestry 2015 was chaired by Archdeacon Richard Litjens on Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup> of March.
Visiting Bishop Michael
Langrish was present at the beginning of the meeting and introduced himself as the retired 70<sup>th</sup> Bishop of the Diocese of Exeter – a diocese which in 2009 celebrated its 1100<sup>th</sup> anniversary!



### **Elections & appointments**

Pre-vestry meetings having been

held in all four centres prior to the Vestry, the appointment of People's Wardens was now confirmed: Pat Roper (St Ann's), Julia Drought (St Margaret's), Stephen Wells (St Philip & St James). No People's Warden had been found for St Stephen's, but Jac Hocking from McLaren Vale had agreed to make up the PDC numbers. Pat Roper would be away for a period in 2015 and Brian McMillan would be Acting Warden in her absence.

In the absence of a parish priest, Priest's Wardens had been confirmed by Archdeacon Richard Litjens as follows: Peter Chapman (St Ann's), Greg John (St Margaret's), Bob Smith (SSPJ) and Ted Sandercock (St Stephen's). Bob Smith would be away for a period and Rupert Best would be Acting Priest's Warden in his absence.

Synod Representatives for Southern Vales: Brian McMillan, Julia Drought, Ted Sandercock, with substitutionary Synod rep. Bill Cale.

#### **Finance & Budget**

Margaret Cale, retired Treasurer, presented her report, noting that our total net income had been \$80,511 (\$14,500 less than budgeted \$95,000), and expenses for the year were \$81,755. This was approximately \$21,855 under budget predictions, partly because we had paid only 8 months of stipend and related costs. She thanked the wardens for counting and banking the money each week.

She reminded us that in our Mission Action Plan we had set a goal to reduce our deficit by 25%. Quoting from a speaker she had heard that week at work, she quoted the following motives for achieving goals:

- 1. Optimism a reason to believe the future can be positive.
- 2. Influence a belief that we can influence it in some way.
- 3. Passion being passionate about what we want and WHY we want it.
- 4. Plan having some idea of how we can make it happen.
- 5. Support being bold enough to ask for help

Margaret then asked us all to think about how we might achieve the budgeted income goal, \$92,000, to cover our expenses. With God's help, she said, we can achieve this, and can support a full-time priest for our PD.

Margaret was thanked for her kindness in continuing this work until a Treasurer for the PD is found.

Several **maintenance matters** had been raised at pre-vestry meetings. Major items were to be referred to the PD Restoration and Maintenance Committee; minor items would be handled by the PDC. The matter of a Retreat for the PD had been deferred by PDC to 2015 and would be on the agenda in March.

Fr Richard highlighted **coming diocesan events** – a Rural Theology day at Mt Barker, led by Bp Michael Langrish, a Pastoral Assistants' Training Day at Port Elliot, "The Importance of Listening", led by Mrs Esther Langrish, and a Diocesan Residential Conference 13<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> April at West Lakes; "Leading your Church into Growth" which aimed to build a core group of committed and inspired people from each parish and pastoral district.

It was noted that conferences and seminars held during the week were difficult for those in paid employment, which included the younger people who, it was hoped, would lead the diocese forward.

A question was raised about **the Pastoral District's relation to St Nicholas, Seaford**. Fr Richard indicated that the matter was being worked on, and Seaford would be included in Southern Vales when a priest was appointed.

A round of applause expressed people's **thanks to Ted Sandercock** for keeping the Pastoral District running in the absence of a parish priest.

## News from St Philip & ST James, Old Noarlunga

A presentation of the Mission Action Plan was made to the congregation after the Eucharist on Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> Of February, using the new projection equipment.

We have enjoyed the Eucharists celebrated by visiting clergy and are grateful to Fr John Devenport for his frequent presence among us. Once again we thank Felicity Warrington and Sue MacKirdy for playing the organ and Ted Sandercock and Margaret Cale who continue to keep the Pastoral District and its finances running smoothly.

Regular maintenance in the cemetery has continued with weed spraying and roses deadheaded. So often there are people wandering around and last week a couple was researching the Sparrow family.

The organ recently donated by the Pearsons has been moved from the Rectory to St Philip & St James and was expertly played there for the first time on the 15<sup>th</sup> of March by Sue MacKirdy. A plaque will be affixed to acknowledge the donors of the one it replaced, Valda & Wilfred Stevens.

## Lenten Soup Suppers 2015



## News from Pastoral District Council

Pastoral District Council for March was chaired by Ted Sandercock.

After PDC opened with prayer, Jac Hocking was welcomed as a new member of PDC standing in for St Stephen's Willunga, and the following elections/appointments for 2015 were confirmed: Secretary: Ted Sandercock. Treasurer: Margaret Cale had resigned as Treasurer but was holding the fort until a Treasurer was found. Minutes Secretary: Di Best

Matters discussed included the following:

#### **Mission Action Plan:**

Jac Hocking had joined the First Aim Team, "To proclaim the good news of the Kingdom" and Pat Roper had been analysing the Baptismal Registers with a view to contacting people baptised in the district over the past 10 years. The team looking at the Third Aim, "To respond to human need by loving service" (led by Wendy Sandercock) had met and was appealing for support for the Christian Care Centre (see p.8). Other groups were still in the planning stages. ( A full report of all groups will be published following the May meeting of PDC).

**Pastoral Team:** A start to be made with a small nucleus of Greg Roberts, Trish Frith, Bob & Susan Smith and Wendy Sandercock, representing each of the four churches, to form the nucleus of a group and see what was needed to get it off the ground – what resources and training would be needed. They would assist with home visiting and home communions, assist non-drivers get to church, follow up baptisms etc. It was noted that the nursing homes had been missing out in the absence of a parish priest.

**Audiovisual equipment** had been purchased and was in use – still awaiting a case and a stand and cover for the screen. It was felt that the new screen was too large for use in some churches. The Secretary to get a price for a new and smaller screen, and a motorised screen for St Ann's. The new speakers made a welcome difference.

The matter of a **PD Weekend Retreat**, deferred from an October meeting to February, was now back on the agenda. Its purpose would be Bible study and social interaction; bringing our four centres together. A place and a date in September to be considered.

**Eucharistic Assistants**: PDC supported Wendy Sandercock, Bob and Susan Smith in having their EA level raised to A1 to enable them to be involved in home communions and administer the chalice.

**Paid advertisements**: Following complaints by individuals, English Rose had withdrawn its ad from *The Grapevine* in March. However, no complaints had been received by PDC, and members voted unanimously that they were happy to include English Rose ads again and considered them quite appropriate.

**Maintenance:** All maintenance matters to be recorded in a book held for the purpose at each church. Small matters (up to \$200) can be attended to, but anything costing over \$200 needs to be approved by PDC. Anything over \$1000 needs to go for consideration by the R&M Committee.

Margaret Cale explained that the annual budget covers the rectory and running costs, but each centre has traditionally covered its own maintenance costs through fund-raising. Some centres had spent over their income, so that the extra had had to be paid for by parish funds which lessens our ability to pay for a priest. There was a need to look seriously at the issue of stewardship. Bishop John had challenged us that parish costs should be met by the collection; fundraising should be for missions and extras.


