MAP Review - 29th November 2015

25 parishioners gathered at St Nicholas', Seaford to participate in a review of the Mission Action Plans for 2015. Fr Ian Young opened the meeting with prayer, and spoke of the Hope we have – an assured Hope – because of the promises we have in Jesus Christ. In this Hope we can be confident of our unchanging God's presence with us in the midst of the change taking place around us, remembering that He has placed us in a constantly changing world. As a result, things do not stay the same. In all the changes taking place, we need to remember that God's hand is in everything, even though we may not see it or understand it and we can be confident God will keep things on track, even if He needs to redirect us at times when we are not listening for (and to) Him and are trying to go our own way or hang onto what we are comfortable with. We also need to remember the absolute necessity of undergirding everything we do with Prayer, seeking not our wants or way, but His will.

Margaret Cale, as Chair, guided the MAP coordinators through the activities undertaken over the year for each of the 5 Aims. They were: Pat Roper (Aim 1: To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom), Peter Chapman (Aim 2: To teach, baptise and nurture new believers), Wendy Sandercock (Aim 3: To respond to human need by loving service), Julia Drought (Aim 4: To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and to pursue peace and reconciliation), Bill Cale (Aim 5: To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth), and for Seaford, Helen Cook & Jane Cuthbert. During the reviews and discussion some 14 topics were

identified for further exploration and possible inclusion on a revised and integrated MAP for 2016.



News from Pastoral District Council November 17th

The meeting opened with prayer and a welcome to Fr Ian Young, *locum tenens* for our Pastoral District until January, and to Jane Cuthbert and Helen Cook from St Nicholas', Seaford (SEM) whose presence at PDC marked one of the first steps in the joining of our Pastoral Districts. Matters discussed included the following:



The MAP Third Aim group ("Loving Care") reported a morning tea for Willunga Primary School, and a Kyton's Christmas fundraiser. An inter-church afternoon tea for Willunga High School was planned. A representative from St Nicholas' would be asked to join the group.

Christmas Tree Festival at Willunga Uniting Church: Ted and Jac would be entering a Jesse Tree.

The **Pastoral Assistants' meeting** with Bp John on 21st October had been a training day. Peter

Chapman reported that the Bishop was taking down red tape to create flexibility and greater freedom for PAs to work more efficiently. He noted a hunger in the Diocese for more training. It was the responsibility of the Pastoral District Council to raise up people for the task, and to see that they were trained.

The Bishop met with the PDC on the same day. Those attending wished that everyone could hear his vision – perhaps through u-tube?

Simplicity Funerals had asked to place a paid ad in the Grapevine, paying in advance \$360 for inclusion in the months April-October, for a three-year period. PDC noted that our special offer had been for 12 issues not 6. We would like to take up their offer for a year, to be re-negotiated after 12 months. A formal letter to be written.

Safer Ministry: It would be good for the diocese to sanction on-line training for those needing it, to tide them over until the next available diocesan training.

The date for **Aldinga on Display** had been changed to March. We would need to advise them of our plans. The Aldinga Uniting Church would be holding Café Church on the Friday.

Finance Report: Margaret noted that it had been a good month, although still not enough to pay a priest's stipend.

Integrated Accounting System: Bob Plummer had visited to discuss this. Margaret (in lieu of a Treasurer) recommended that we should consider joining the IAS but do have some concerns and should not rush into it. We would require monthly reports, year to date reports and transaction reports; and invoices should not go straight to the diocese but should be checked first by us for errors. The IAS would increase control over us — but how much control have we anyway? The IAS will require a full-time diocesan salary, but in balance, already some parishes are paying treasurers, and diocesan auditing costs are "off the planet". It will have the advantage that it will make provision for poorer parishes. However we would not be able to do anything until we have sorted out our relationship with St Nicholas'.

Amalgamation with St Nicholas', Seaford: Ted to advise Bp John that St Nicholas' would be officially part of Southern Vales from the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of January. Fr Ian is happy to facilitate planning discussions.

Unsold bread donated to St Ann's and the Aldinga Uniting Church by Home Grain Bakery, Aldinga, on Saturday afternoons is collected by the two churches, doing the distributing month and month about. The bread is given to people in need – or taken by anyone, with a donation given to the Christian Care & Community Centre.

Carols: together with the Aldinga Uniting Church, Southern Vales parishioners will sing carols at the Aldinga Friday Market on the 4th of December, and the Seaford Carols in the market place will be on the 6th of December 6-8 pm. →

St Ann's will be the venue for an end of year **concert** for an Aldinga music teacher. Her gold coin admission charge to be offered to the church. Money over the \$60 hiring fee could go to the Christian Care & Community Centre.

St Margaret's was feeling the need of a **data projector**, as sharing one with St Ann's had complications. There were several advantages in having words on powerpoint, and it was considered a good tool for interaction with younger families. New songs can be introduced. A single powerpoint could be produced for all centres to use. St Margaret's was congratulated on the two recent services, the Family Service and St Margaret's Day.

Our MAP group met again on Thursday the 26th with many positive ideas discussed, and we took part in the MAP review day at SEM on the 29th of November (see p. 1).



A Walk for Refugees event on October the 31st was a most successful occasion, with about 280 people taking part. Ted and Wendy represented the Southern Vales on the planning group and several members of the PD of Southern Vales participated. The crowd that came for the walk was very diverse, with a small number from Roman Catholic parishes from Morphett Vale to Victor Harbor and others from other churches, as well as a large number from the broad spectrum of non-church-going people in the local community.

A large group of Pakistanis from the Ahmadiyya Muslim Association took part, continuing the growing relationship that began a month before with the World Day of Prayer for Peace, in which they had taken part.

Galilee parishioner Peter Laffan says that he hopes the enthusiasm generated by the march will be built on, to establish a Fleurieu and Kangaroo Island Catholic justice, peace and ecology network.
