



The Murray Progress meeting (4<sup>th</sup> May, St Ann's 2-4 pm and St Nicholas' 6-8 pm, "Come, talk, walk with us") is an invitation from Diocesan Council to engage us all in plans for the future directions of the Diocese—and these will involve our Pastoral District. Come and hear the changes the Council is proposing and contribute to a common vision for our Diocese. The formation of our Diocese is what we are challenged to work on together. It needs a holistic approach, and in the Bishop's words, "this must necessarily include our pastoral provision, our evangelistic ministry, our liturgical life, our financial life and a proper stewardship of the resources that are at our disposal." These matters will then be discussed at a Diocesan level at Synod in May, and at a Special Call of Synod on 5<sup>th</sup> of November. This is our opportunity to be part of the Murray Progress, to ask questions and seek clarifications, the results of which will affect us all well into the future. Fr Glenn encourages EVERY member of the Pastoral District of the Southern Vales to be present at one of these very important meetings.

# "Look what God did with one woman!!"



A procession of the banners of the MU branches from the different parishes and pastoral districts made a brave showing on a perfect Autumn day for the Diocesan Mothers' Union gathering at St Margaret's on the 4<sup>th</sup> of April .

With "Lady Day" celebrating the annunciation to Mary of the birth of Jesus, celebrant Bishop John Ford spoke of the parallel between conception and creation. He also

spoke about the role of women in the world. He had been amazed by a Mothers' Union gathering in Ghana, with 500 MU members, and by all that they achieved. "And look what God did with one woman, Mary," he said. "Just imagine what he could do with 50!"

Bruce Cliff was the speaker at the luncheon that followed. He spoke movingly from his experience of family, of work with youth, and of the need for teenagers to have somewhere safe to "chill".

### News from Pastoral District Council

Our Pastoral District Council met on the 19<sup>th</sup> of April and was chaired by Ted Sandercock. Matters discussed included the following (other matters are included elsewhere in this issue).

#### **Mission Action Plan**

**Aim 1 Group "To proclaim the good news of the Kingdom"** reported the need to explore formal **training opportunities** for lay teams delivering Family Services. **June Gillion**, wife of Bishop Gillion of the Diocese of Riverina would come on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of June and give an evening assisting with non-Eucharistic worship training. That week is Schools Ministry Week, and Pastoral Support Workers could also be involved.

It recommended a formal **stewardship campaign** to be held this year.

**Redesign of the PD website** is considered urgent, and PDC approved a budget for redesigning and setting up a new website for Southern Vales and training personnel to manage it.

Aim 2 Group "To teach, baptise and nurture new believers" would like to promote youth involvement in the Sea Hawks ecumenical group at SEM. St Nicholas' members would like to join the Aim 2 group. They also supported Family Services, Prayer, Praise & Proclamation services, small groups, Bible Studies, Home Groups and Confirmation.Fr Glenn reported that the Bishop had set the date of the 17<sup>th</sup> of July for a Confirmation service. He would like a team of people from Southern Vales to be involved in preparation of candidates.

**Rationalisation of PD properties**: Two representatives and experts from Anglicare have been to look at the vacant land at St Margaret's and reviewed the earlier proposal.

**SSPJ Building**: Brian McMillan circulated a paper containing an overview of issues which had to be addressed before a way forward could be determined, including the fact that it is a landmark building, technical advice received, and its State Heritage status. It was encouraging that the Bishop was committed to its restoration as a valuable building, and with the housing development in Hackham spreading south, Fr Glenn considered that our PD may well in future be oriented northwards. Restoration would require a big commitment from all of our centres and would require a lot of work. The back wall needs inspection by experts, and the Vestry needs to be taken down to a point and rebuilt.

A Restoration Committee was formed consisting of Rupert Best (SSPJ) Chair, Bob Smith (SSPJ), Peter Chapman (St Ann's), Brian McMillan (St Ann's, and Vice President of NTSA) and Jane Cuthbert (St Nicholas'). A member of the St Stephen's congregation will also be asked. Margaret Cale had explored funds potentially available for SSPJ repair work, and Bob Smith had had confirmation of money available towards the Uretek foundation injection (see *GV* May). Public and community support could be involved, and people, as well as money, could be used. The St Ann's congregation actually did the building of their hall.

**Finance Report** *See table, p. 9.* While the retired Treasurer considered that the deficit was not significant at this stage, Fr Glenn was concerned that offertories were down.

**Diocesan Synod (May 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup>)** will be followed on Saturday evening, 28<sup>th</sup> of May, by the **St Philip & St James' Patronal Festival service** at 5.30 pm. The Rev'd Daniel Irvine will be guest preacher and Deacon at the Eucharist.

Fr Glenn will be away from the PD between 29<sup>th</sup> May-8<sup>th</sup> June.

**Licencing and Safe Ministry training**: Any Bishop, priest, deacon, warden, choir director, person involved in youth or elderly ministry, leadership of worship, official home visitor, op shop manager or a role leading a service, needs Safe Ministry Training, police checks and new licencing. A Safe Ministry training session will be held at St Margaret's on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> of August, and a Refresher Course on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> of August.

**Discover Willunga Fair:** The Uniting, Catholic and Coast and Vines churches in Willunga are having an ecumenical stall in which St Stephen's will participate with brochures, copies of *The Grapevine*, a modern version of St Luke and perhaps copies of Micheal Perrott's book *Reflecting with Creation* for sale.

Peter Chapman had been invited to attend the two-day **National Conference on Church Planting and Pioneer Ministry** in Melbourne, representing our Diocese. He and Greg John would attend the Keith training session (Study of the Pauline Epistles, 29<sup>th</sup> Apr-1<sup>st</sup> May).
