News from St Stephen's, Willunga

The **Saturday Night Out Dinner** on June 11th, 2016 at the Willunga Hotel was attended by 10 people. The next Saturday Night Out will be on July 9th at the Willunga Hotel after the 5.30 pm service. All are welcome to join the St Stephen's core group on the usual Second Saturday of the month.

Thanks to Fr Dennis for his ministry over the two Saturdays Fr Glenn was away.

John Strachan has been recommended by Fr Glenn to join the Sandercocks as a Eucharistic Assistant on Saturday evenings. John has had considerable experience in this role in other Parishes in the Diocese. He has agreed to undertake this role.

Our prayers continue for both **Elaine and Fr John Edwards**. Elaine's foot problem has continued to improve. Prayers too for Peter Kyloh who has beenin FMC with breathing problems.

Maintenance: In the early months of 2013, maintenance was done on the external walls of St Stephen's. This work was completed in June 2013. The City of Onkaparinga provided a small heritage grant for this work. The Heritage Architect, Grant Stevens, advised that the internal cracks should wait up to 3 or 4 years before they were repaired to ensure that the external work had settled and that the internal cracks had stabilised. As the PD is looking at its future it seems to be the time to attend to this work. From discussions with two painters the estimated cost would be about \$3000. It is suggested that funds of at least this amount be raised before any work begins. The following approaches are suggested:

- * Willunga Anglican families be approached for a donation or an interest free loan
- * An application to SA government small grants (up to \$5000) to upgrade infrastructure so that an organisation is better able undertake its work. It will be important to emphasise the relationship of St Stephen's with the Willunga community in, for example, the 2014 Willunga 175 celebrations, Discover Willunga showcase in 2014, 2015 & 2016, our produce stall during the Willunga Almond Blossom Festival, the QR Code heritage plaque (the only religious building included), free car park each Saturday morning for the Willunga Farmers Market, involvement in Schools Ministry morning teas for school staff and our involvement in History Week.

 Other suggestions welcome.

The Vigil Eucharist is held on a Saturday at 5.30 pm. All welcome. You might like to attend when for some reason you are unable to attend a Sunday Service. Refreshments afterwards with sherry or wine & nibbles (cheese, dips and biscuits).

It was ably led by our young people, who enacted a drama on preparing for mission. In addition the congregation was treated to an animated and lively address and video, "Going the Distance", presented by Steven and Lyn Davis (and

learned about the work of **BCA** and their field staff, who since 1919, have been supporting people living and working in remote and isolated communities in Australia. At the conclusion of the service there was a special collection to aid BCA as well as goodies to buy from a trading table set up by Lyn and Stephen.

Some of our members have also attended church services and functions at other venues in the Southern Vales in the past month and have enjoyed being part of our wider Church community. The celebration of **St Philip and St James' Day** at St Margaret's was especially enjoyed by those who attended and our Synod Reps Joanie Rawlings and Joan Dare also particularly enjoyed their time of fellowship with other Southern Vales Reps at **Synod.**

Information Sharing: On June 12th a meeting was held after the service to discuss the latest developments and issues in the Southern Vales and at SEM. There was a good attendance and as a result of information sharing various members agreed to join in with various MAP groups. We have decided to hold further meetings of this kind on the second Sunday of each month.

Prayer services led by various members of the SEM community are being held on Tuesday evenings from 6.30 pm until 7.00 pm. On Sunday June 19th there was an Ecumenical Prayer Service led by Father Charles (Catholic community) and Mark Kaesler (Lutheran community). A "soup and roll" tea followed this! It is hoped that these services will become a regular part of SEM worship in the future.

The **Fellowship group** met on Thursday 16th June for lunch in the SEM Café followed by a discussion of fundraising ideas. The next meeting will be held on Thursday 21st July at 1.30pm

SEM: Mission and Ministry: Our representatives on this committee are Joan Dare and Helen Cook. In the most recent meetings there has been considerable discussion and planning for the 20th Birthday celebrations of SEM to be held on Sunday 7th August at 10.30 am, as well as sorting through suggestions of a "more relevant" name for SEM. It has been suggested that Seaford Ecumenical Mission be our legal name but we could adopt an everyday trading name without having to make constitutional changes. All member congregations have been asked to put forward their ideas for a "Brand" name for the centre.

Committee of Management: Joyce Newing and Cathy More are our reps on this committee. The most recent meetings have focused on the future use and lease arrangements of the buildings currently occupied by Government Health Services, and the implications of the Uniting Church's request to terminate its role as a major shareholder at SEM. Ecumenical Endeavours, the legal entity and the Heads of Churches will deal with these issues. Locally at SEM there is little we can do but pray for a successful outcome for all our congregations.

School's Ministry Meeting: Jane Cuthbert and Helen Cook were our reps at a meeting at Seaford Secondary College on Friday 17th June, also attended by the local Pastoral Support Workers, the local and regional leaders of SMG as well as leaders from the local church groups. Discussion revolved around the importance of interaction with the local faith communities, the effectiveness of the chaplains in the schools, and ways to support, thank and encourage the staff in the local schools.

At the Cambodia

At the **Cambodian Night** on the 17th of June we heard two inspiring stories of projects to improve conditions for people in Cambodia. Jeff Jeanes, with Debbie, spoke of his cycle ride from Ho Chi Minh City to Siem Reap to raise money for World Vision's Rukh Kiri area development project. This programme is bringing new ideas to

encourage and improve education in the area, to improve health and birthing, and by means of bringing people together, to share ideas on improving agricultural opportunitiesbreaking the poverty cycle. Carol Duncan,

who had contributed to a programme called SHE (Support Her Enterprise) in 2015,






spoke movingly about the programme's helping women recognise and develop business opportunities and training, in a culture in which women traditionally didn't have these opportunities. She spoke of the economic changes it was bringing to their lives, and the strength, the hope and the belief in themselves which resulted. She brought samples of beads and silks made by the women, including a beautiful silk shawl. Tony showed a DVD he had made of the project.

Guests shared a meal of Cambodian dishes, and tasted a pumpkin dessert provided by the Duncans. The evening's proceeds (\$ 560) were shared between the two projects.

Ray and his wife Frances came to Australia from England, living at Hackham and then Christies Beach, and becoming generous supporters of St Philip & St James' congregation. Ray and Frances had been involved in catering in England, and with the help of their family, for several years ran marvellous parish luncheons at their son Paul's home. The congregation was often invited to their family celebrations. Ray was a great gardener and a skilled handyman, seeing to maintenance matters needing attention at the church. He had an enquiring mind, and was interested in information technology.

Ray was a devoted carer for Frances for some years when she became ill. In later years he lived at Hackham, which made it difficult for him to attend St Philip & St James.

He died on the 6th of June.

News from Pastoral District Council

The June meeting of the PDC was held on Tuesday 28th.

Bob Smith's resignation as Priest's Warden for St Philip & St James' had been received. PDC passed a **vote of thanks to Bob** for his work as a Warden. **New appointee Judy Wells** was welcomed to the meeting.

Matters discussed included the following:

Focus business: Mission Action Plan: Team 1 (*To proclaim the good news of the Kingdom***)** had met to discuss how our website could be updated to include the information they believed should be included, and had decided to put their thoughts into a project format to give to Archdeacon Carlsson. They believed that it was time for rejuvenation of the MAP groups, and suggested that they might all meet together, and that this might be an opportunity for Peter Chapman and Greg John to speak about their formation training courses.

Worship: Fr Glenn reported that a worship roster had been worked out to the end of August. On Saturday 30th of July the PD service was to be the Eucharist at St Stephen's (Fr Glenn's last service). On Sunday 31st July there would be a Family Service at St Ann's at 9 am but the main service for the day would be the Ecumenical service at SEM at 10.45 am, which he hoped we would attend. There would be a private baptism at St Margaret's at 9 am.

Seaford Ecumenical Mission is going through a time of change and uncertainty (*see News from St Nicholas'*, *p. 5: Committee of Management*). They very much need our support at the present time. Fr Glenn, who had recently been to an excellent ecumenical service at SEM, spoke of the importance of the churches concentrating on what they *can* do together instead of worrying about the what divides us. It was pointed out that ecumenical events can happen in other locations as well, and had done so on occasions in the past.

Pastoral Assistants and others in ministry: A list of people in ministry in the PD was reviewed. To be eligible, applicants needed to attend church at least 26 times in a year. Safe ministry courses were being run in August (*see p. 2*). Fr Glenn, who had completed the CCER Salt Compliance course, passed on some practical tips regarding the ethical use of emails:

- NEVER assume that your emails are private
- * ALWAYS consider: would you be happy if your email was posted on a staff noticeboard or read out in court?

Clergy meeting at St Margaret's, 16th June: Fr Glenn thanked Margaret Cale and Helen and Greg Roberts for their help and for an excellent meal, and Brian and the choir for their music and singing. PD support had been appreciated by the clergy.

SSPJ church building: The SSPJ Building Committee (Brian McMillan, Stephen Wells and Jane Cuthbert) had met with engineer Ashley Holmes that morning. A report would be forthcoming.

Advent Pageant: With the resignation of Stephanie Turvey this year, Fusion's Adelaide South branch no longer existed. and Fusion would no longer cover the Pageant's public liability. Other options and opportunities to be explored.
