### Congratulations to S.E.M: an ecumenical celebration.

On the 7<sup>th</sup> of August the Seaford Ecumenical Mission celebrated 20 years of worship and service to the Seaford community at a combined service and luncheon. The service was led by representatives of the participating churches (Lutheran Pastor Mark Kaesler, Roman Catholic Fr Tom Gleeson, Anglican Fr Alex Stone, Church of Christ representative Suzanne Weber and Uniting Church minister Rev. David Ingleton) with singing led by a composite choir, and rainbow coloured cloths providing a harmony of colours contributed by the Catholic School (see this in colour on the pD website). In the message preached by Lutheran Bishop David Altus, appropriate to the uncertain times, he noted that we were on a journey: in the Acts of the Apostles Christians were referred to as followers of "the way". Whether we have a building or not, we always have a Kingdom. A number of Anglicans from all centres of Southern Vales Pastoral District joined in the day's celebration. In his sermon Daniel warned against the danger of valuing our traditions and



institutions more highly than our Lord: sometimes we cling to what is known and familiar, like a protective shell.

After the service a large number went up to Willunga's Bush Inn to a delicious and promptly served dinner together.



### News from Pastoral District Council

At the meeting on the 16<sup>th</sup> of August chaired by Ted Sandercock, matters discussed included the following:

**Mission Action Plan**: Pat Roper for Group 1 (To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom) reported that Margaret Cale had talked to the Vicar-General about websites and had prepared a letter as a basis for further discussion. Glen Laundy of Tekspec had been contacted re the current cost of a training course for us to use our website.

**Worship**: Anglicans at Seaford Ecumenical Mission were inviting the Uniting Church and Church of Christ to worship with them when they had no minister available.

**St Philip & St James' Church Building**: A very positive discussion had been held between Vicar-General Peter Carlsson, Brian McMillan, Stephen Wells and Judith Wells, and the matter is under active consideration by the Vicar-General. It was mentioned that English Rose Funerals had offered support for fund-raising, and Old Noarlunga townsfolk might also assist in raising money for repairs.

**Almond Blossom stalls**: Thanks to those – with all centres working together – who made it so successful; the most money ever raised (*see final figure p. 2*). Ted made special mention of great support from St Nicholas' congregation.

**St Stephen's Patronal Festival**: (see p. 2) A good day. The dinner had worked well and Bush Inn had been re-booked for Saturday Night Out on the 10<sup>th</sup> of September.

Brad Huddleston would be visiting the area to talk about the **effect of the media and IT** on young people at an open meeting on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> of October at Almond Grove Church. While not supporting him financially we would promote it.

**Painting St Margaret's**: It had proved impossible over six months to get a third quote for the job – the building was considered high and difficult to paint. We would need to ask Diocesan Council for permission to go ahead with the two quotes. The painting of the flagpole to be paid for separately by a donation.

**St Stephen's repairs**: The State Government does not accept applications from churches but an application had been made to the City of Onkaparinga Heritage Dept. \$1500 had been donated so far towards costs.

**Stewardship** envelopes to go out in September to be used from October. People to be encouraged to use direct debit.

**Hall hiring agreements** need to be reviewed annually. Forms received from Church Office need further consideration.

The **Prickle Team** was thanked for their generosity in donating \$300 towards the Ministry Training Fund, which is used for training both clergy and lay people. PDC decided to make a further appeal to the churches at the end of August.

**Home Communions**: Greg Roberts, who was present as an observer, was thanked for his ministry of home communions. A list was needed of who was being visited, to avoid duplication by visitors.

A **meeting with Bishop John** by Greg John, Brian McMillan, Chris Gunn and Ted Sandercock to discuss "Walking the Way", The Murray Progress, had been very helpful. The proposal was to divide the diocese into 8 mission districts with 4 hubs. Yankalilla and Delamere would join with Southern Vales to form one of those districts, with two priests. On September 28<sup>th</sup> 12 people selected from this area would meet with Margaret Philpott from Diocesan Council to discuss the vision and the practicalities of this. Charts outlining the proposal are available at all churches.

**Faculties for St Margaret's**: Faculties for the following are being applied for from DC: the installation of a new organ casing, removal of book shelves from the wall, the sale of four pews surplus to requirement and the installation of a moveable font to replace the unsafe one.

As the PDC meeting was held on the birthday of its Chairman, Ted, the meeting ended with birthday cake and coffee!

Next meeting Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September.



"In these troubled times, Lord show us how to care." St Ann's August Family Service (actually held on the 31<sup>st</sup> of July) began with hot coffee around a brazier at the church door.

The Gospel message about abundance of possessions was reinforced by a film, "The Miniature Earth Mad World" highlighting the world's inequalities, concluding "If you keep your food in a refrigerator, your clothes in a closet, if you have a bed to sleep in and a roof over your head, you are better off than 75% of the entire world's population. Appreciate what you have, and do your best for a better world". A time of silence which followed was a chance for

people to light a prayer candle for concerns that were troubling them.

### News from St Ann's, Aldinga

We have had to say goodbye to our locum Glenn Maytum after his time with us. We have been fortunate to have had his input and slant on Christian worship which helped rouse us from complacency too easily slipped into. His enthusiasm and commitment were welcomed and his services of baptism in his time with us were particularly delightful and relevant to us and the peoples concerned. So we sincerely say, "Thank you Glenn," and wish him well and God's speed in his future endeavours.

Our service times have been changed around this last month. Our latest Family Service was on the last Sunday of the month instead of the first. We have been told by our own that we are getting more "professional" in our preparation and presentation. It is good to be told by former doubters that they like them and get something from coming to them now. We have been having an increased number of people attending all services over the last month or so. Numbers are more into the thirties than the twenties currently. There are several new faces returning.

Our Friends of St Ann's meeting was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> of August with a good roll-up. The meeting covered such things as feedback from Family Services, and Brian reported on his meeting with the bishop and the Murray Progress's "Walking the Way". It was decided that \$300 of the Prickle Team's money (see opposite) would go to the Diocesan Ministry Training Fund and the allocation of the balance to be decided when the final figure is known.

Quiz night raised \$670, to be shared between BCA and Christian Care Centre.

Many thanks to all who made food and donated produce for the Parish fundraiser, the Almond Blossom Festival, and to those who manned the stall in Willunga on the day.

Friends are considering the replacement of pews with chairs and Margaret Cale has prepared an excellent display of possibilities for people to ponder and discuss. However with other large decisions about the future of the church at present it is not considered an appropriate time to proceed currently. A moveable signboard has been approved. Drainage and pot holes around the church are issues being addressed by Bill Cale.



Trish Frith presented us with a Bee Hotel given to us by the Yacca group, a group of Willunga young people who have been looking at developing plans with Trish for our church garden.

The Bible study of Revelation concluded this month. Thank you Julianne for your inspiring leadership. It has been good to see new people coming to join in the group as it progressed.

Brad Chapman (see photo in News from St Nicholas', p. 5) came and spoke about the Anglican Board of Mission on the 21st of August, and inspired us all with his message and enthusiasm.
