## Walking The Way - Future Vision

Representatives of the seven Congregations making up the future Southern Vales Ministry District met at St Ann's Hall on the 11<sup>th</sup> of October 2016 with Bishop John, and Margaret Philpott and Des Warner representing the present Diocesan Council.

Key Points made by Margaret Philpott were:

Our Aim is to grow – in faithfulness, vision and outreach—and we should be doing only what is essential to achieve that Aim.

The Diocese is a family – of Pilgrims sharing our journey with Bishop John. The three Focus elements under our Vision and Mission are:

Identity – how we relate to Jesus

Community – how we relate to others in the life of the Spirit Place – where we love, serve and worship God.

The Diocese will comprise eight Ministry Districts, each having one Clerical and one Lay Member on Diocesan Council, as well as six further Lay Members on Synod. Our ministry district will include Yankalilla and Delamere as well as our present five Southern Vales congregations.

Diocesan Council will take responsibility for such matters as finance,



#### Walking the Way - Future Vision cont'd

... buildings, pastoral organisation, staffing, aspects of maintenance, .Risk, and Work Health and Safety. However each community will continue to work out the best way forward, following their own priorities and making their own decisions.

The Finance and Audit Committee has worked out that if we establish a common family fund (or family purse) it will be possible to pay 19 stipends which would cover the Bishop, the Vicar-General and seventeen priests. Thus no area would be worse off than at present, so far as Stipendiary Ministry is concerned.

Key Points made by Bishop John were:

Ministry Districts will be invited to commence operating In November on an "as if" basis – that is, as if the new arrangements were approved and in place – sharing resources.

Ministry Districts will be invited to donate 12% of their Special Purposes Funds to the common family fund (or family purse). This would mean that money presently idle would be made to work.

Progress, not procrastination, is required. The ultimate Message is: "To do nothing is to wither and fade away".



## News from St Nicholas', Seaford

**Services:** During the past month our services have again had the support of Fr Ted Newing, Fr David and Fr Percy and Cathy More. We are very fortunate to have these wonderful people assisting in our services. Both Helen Cook and Christine Gunn are back with us, or will be shortly, which will be another boon to our weekly worship. This month the Youth Led Worship will be replaced by Morning Prayer on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday.

**Outreach** This month saw the opening of the BCA boxes from the supporters at St Nicholas and the filling of shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. We were also approached by the Pastoral Support Worker at Old Noarlunga School, Christine Oxenham, for support after the recent flooding in the area.

Several families have had to leave their homes whilst repairs take place, so much was lost which was especially distressing for the children. We held a closing collection and were able to donate \$200 to Christine to help those in most need. As Christine is not attached to a local church (she worships in Aberfoyle Park) it is hoped that in the future St Nicholas and St Philip and St James' congregation can take up that role.

**Bible Study**: Our study on the Lord's Prayer has finished but we are looking forward to perhaps a new Advent Study.


**Youth Led Worship:** We are fortunate in having such an inspiring and active group of young people who enjoy planning and running these worship sessions once a month. Although there will not be a Youth Worship in October, they are in the process of planning a Thanksgiving/Harvest theme for the November worship and an updated Nativity for the December service. NB: The December Youth Led Service will be on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in December instead of the fourth, which is of course, Christmas Day.

**Fellowship**: The group has met for lunch in the SEM Café followed by our monthly chat sessions. This month we planned for our next concert on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> of November (see above). Proceeds of the concert will be split between Fellowship funds and Southern Vales PD funds.

**Walking the Way:** I was privileged to represent St Nicholas' at a meeting with members of Diocesan Council and Bp John at St Ann's. It was an informative and interactive meeting about the 5 year vision for the Diocese. There will be changes in the future and adjustments to make, but Southern Vales is one of the 'Hubs' that will benefit from these proposals.

STOP PRESS: At a meeting held at SEM on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October, called by the heads of the Heads of the Lutheran, Uniting and Catholic Churches, (those who initially funded SEM) the SEM community was informed that all three parties had come to the decision that the SEM building was to be sold. As you can imagine the meeting, which went for 3 hours, was very impassioned and all were upset and in some cases angry at this decision. Follow up meetings to discuss ways forward for the 5 denominations are to be held in the near future. Please keep all of our brothers and sisters at SEM in your prayers during what is going to be a difficult time for us all.

## News from Pastoral District Council

The October meeting was chaired by Ted Sandercock. It was not possible for representatives from Yankalilla or Delamere (now to be considered part of Southern Vales Mission District) to attend on this occasion. Matters discussed included the following, and other matters are covered elsewhere.

Mission Action Plan: Group I (Proclaim the good news of the Kingdom) reported on discussions on the planned revision of the PD website. It will now include Yankalilla and Delamere as well as our other current centres and will be modelled on that of West Dartmoor (UK) which has 7 centres, and where Nick Shutt is the rector. The main page will have a Google map of the District and a menu with many topics for information and interest for visitors to the site; e.g. under Our Churches, each centre will provide information and photos for its own page. The site will be user friendly for non-church people. We envisage one person will be in charge and a member from each centre responsible for keeping information up to date either personally or through the person in charge. *The Grapevine* linked to it could be updated weekly. \$1,500 has been approved to be withdrawn from the Shirley Garfitt Bequest to cover costs of setting up and the training of those who will work on the site.

**St Margaret's church**: Plans to move the cross which was originally on the inside wall of the church to the outside have not been able to go ahead because of its weight and a crack in the wall. It would be obscured by the bottle-brush bushes if it were placed on the ground in front of the church. It was suggested that the flagpole could be moved to the St Margaret's sign and the cross be placed in front of the Memorial Garden where the flagpole is now.

**Aldinga Bay Community Carols, 11**<sup>th</sup> **of December:** Southern Vales has been offered the chance to have a stall at the carols, with, for example, brochures about our Pastoral District. The choir will be asked to sing. Our Nativity float could once again be taken to the event.

Discussion was held on the subject of the possibility that our Pastoral District might revive the custom of holding a **Harvest Festival** and what form it might take.

**Bishop John** will be preaching in the Cathedral at Murray Bridge on Sundays through November.



As part of Aldinga On Display on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of November we advertised ourselves as welcoming people to our Church for a service and/or to join us for morning tea while being entertained by delightful background music provided by Greg John. We wished morning tea could always be like that! We were very pleased to have two more paintings by John Freeman in the church. After morning tea we had a fascinating cemetery tour led by Brian McMillan, which some visitors as well as members of the congregation attended, discovering the first grave, the graves of settlers from the first ship, the *Buffalo*, looking at old slate graves with Masonic symbols and the engraver's name, and noticing the different styles of graves since those early times.







On Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> we were blessed not only by Fr Jeff Oake taking our service and giving among other things an unforgettable account of his "gibbon flight" in Thailand, but also, after the service, a talk by the Rev'd Ginnie Geraerts from the Church of St Wilfrid in Cheshire, U.K., who was visiting her mother and sisters, members of the St Ann's congregation. Morning tea stopped and you could have heard a pin drop as Ginnie recounted her seven years' path to ordination, and her experience as a hospital chaplain, "taking the Gospel to where people are". She urged us to recognise and affirm the gifts of the people in our congregations, that whatever God is calling us to do and be, a word from someone else may help us to recognise it. And when God has a plan for us it will come clear—perhaps over time. As Fr Jeff said, like the small but vital needles in a sewing machine, each of us has an important role to play in God's plan, however insignificant we may think we are.





"Weeds over the fence" are a constant problem at this time of the year— particularly when the seeds dry out and fly into the gardens. The next-door neighbour at St Ann's made a preliminary onslaught on them by driving his tractor and cutter along the top of the levee on his side of the fence. He scaled the heights successfully but couldn't (and didn't) manage the weeds on St Ann's side of the levee. Oh well...
