



#### A word from Fr Peter...

Dear Friends,

I find it pleasing to think that my proposed six month stint as locum (part time) in the Southern Vales, will include the wonderful annual journey we make with our Lord during the forty days of Lent and the fifty days (some were taught forty) of Eastertide. We seek to be renewed during Lent, through penitence. The colour purple is symbolic of repentance.

A personal review (through self-examination of conscience) and an act of repentance make a very helpful Lenten practice. In this way we hope to maintain a state of grace — our baptismal state. A few of us will make the usual pre-Easter trek to

confessional to be assured of forgiveness. I have always (from childhood) greatly valued this aid to renewal, both as a penitent and confessor.

From the early centuries, the lead-up to Easter was seen as a time for those who had lapsed (perhaps during the crucible of persecution) to be restored and for enquirers to be prepared for baptism. What bet-

ter time for baptism than at Easter, when we pass over with Christ from death to life, from bondage to freedom, from sin to righteousness, from darkness into light.

The Church's rites during Holy Week (especially in the great three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter, i.e. The Triduum), are simply a "must", and are best seen as a continuing act of worship, as we journey with Jesus from the Last Supper and Gethsemane, to his Cross and to his Rising. It all reaches a wonderful culmination in the Easter Vigil, with lighted candles and baptismal water, which will be celebrated this year at St Stephen's, Willunga, on Holy Saturday (Easter Eve).

Because of the historic precedent of preparing candidates during this Season, Lent has been regarded from early times as a season in which to make a special effort to learn more about and to grow in our Christian Faith; so Lenten studies are to be encouraged and eagerly welcomed. We are fortunate this year in being able to use Bishop John's Lenten Study, *Spare a Minute*. I have always found that joining a group for such studies is richly rewarding and am glad to commend to you the groups for Lent now offered in Southern Vales (*see p. 8*). There should be enough days and times for you to find a time to suit.

Making a Lenten Rule is also a useful thing to do. Don't make it too unattainable, and see it as a time for positive initiatives rather than rigorous denials.

I like this little Lenten reminder card (L).

May God bless you, in your Lenten Pilgrimage. Peter.

#### News from St Philip & St James, Old Noarlunga

Hi, Fellow Brothers and Sisters in Christ

Work to recover The Church on the Hill progresses slowly and will continue to do so as we strive to do the best job we can to keep the c(C)hurch\* secure for the next 100 years.

Brian McMillan, Peter Chapman, Rupert Best and Judy Wells met with Will Allen from Heritage Stone Restorations at St Philip and St James on 20/02/17 to discuss what needs to be done, in what order and at what cost.

It was decided that underpinning the eastern wall of the sanctuary and Vestry is the most effective path. To that end we will ask for quotes to design the plan and once we have it, quotes to engineer it. Will suggested digging an air trench around the church to drain water away from the wall and assist with management of the salt damp.

Peter has also reported that he has received offers of help from three sources in Old Noarlunga.

Brian is going to approach the National Trust regarding a National Trust Appeal to be set up for Saint Philip and Saint James as money donated to it will be tax deductable. Having said that, the time is also close when we need to let both the people of Old Noarlunga and the City of Onkaparinga generally know, as they too have ongoing ties to "our c(C)hurch".

As in all things we look to our Bishop and through him the Vicar General for guidance and blessings on our endeavours. We ask all of you for your prayers.

#### News from Pastoral District Council

The meeting was chaired by Ted Sandercock, with Fr Peter Thomson in attendance. Matters discussed included the following:

Walking the Way: Clergy and wardens of Southern Vales and Yankalilla/Delamere attended a Walking the Way meeting on Mon. 13<sup>th</sup> February when three members from the Diocesan Finance and Property team, Bruce Stanley, Jeff McHugh and Fr David Price, came to discuss our commitment towards the Diocesan Vision for the future. Bruce Stanley addressed the topic of gifts to the Home Mission Fund to assist with the resourcing of 3.5 additional clergy in the Diocese. (It is proposed that an additional half time position be allocated to the Southern Vales Ministry District.) The goal is to raise \$500,000 to fund this aim for at least the first year, after which the hope is that growth will enable funding to be generated from within the Ministry Districts. It was suggested that 12% of all Special Purpose Funds held with the Diocese might be gifted as a one off contribution to raise this funding. The Pastoral District Council agreed to gift \$50,000 (sourced from various accounts) to this Fund.

The Integrated Accounting System previously promoted is not being continued. An alternative way of operating is a work in progress.

Jeff McHugh raised the matter of Ministry District properties: what would be a suitable location for rectories? What was the situation with Ss Philip & James' land?

We need to make decisions about the way ahead, then consider what finance and property we would need to achieve that.

**Mission Action Plan**: some of the teams need to be re-formed, as things had tended to "run down" at the end of the year with many other matters to be worked on. Leaders will be contacted and encouraged to do this.

**Website**: The Aim 1 action group had met to look at the new temporary website. Pat Roper, its co-ordinator, needed photos and information about the churches to send to Glen Laundy for the update. The site would be based on the one for West Dartmoor. Permission was needed to be obtained from those photographed, and new forms will be made available. Meanwhile any children photographed must still have permission forms filled by parents/guardians.

**Towards a Ministry District**: Considering the formation of a Ministry District consisting of the present PDs of Southern Vales and Yankalilla/Delamere, it is proposed that a Ministry District Council consisting of stipendiary clergy, one warden from each centre, the secretary, the treasurer and a chair appointed from one of the other wardens, meet every two months. This Council would be responsible for governance and strategic direction, and financial oversight of anything costing over \$250.

Each church centre would have a group such as a Guild or Friends .These will be responsible for local matters, and will report to the Ministry District Council. *The Grapevine* will continue to include news from all centres.

The Treasurer explained that our year's insurance had been paid in full instead of monthly, helping the diocese. She also pointed out that council rates would soon have to be paid, from the Special Purpose Funds. It was noted that although we had been prepared under present circumstances to hold only two Eucharistic services a month in each church, we were in fact managing to have three, with relieving clergy. However, the Treasurer pointed out the cost of this. While we are not meeting our budgeted target, can we really afford it?

The **McLaren Vale Harvest Festival** on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February had been a huge event. The churches' role had been led by Fr Ted Newing, Fr Charles Gauci and Pastor Mark Kaesler. We need to ensure greater participation by our church.

Yankalilla/Delamere had proposed an open-air Ministry District event to be held on Sun 30<sup>th</sup> April. However, that would be Ss Philip & James' Patronal Festival at St Margaret's. Yankalilla/Delamere to be invited to this instead.

The importance of **prayer meetings** was emphasised and encouraged.

The next meeting of PDC will be on Tuesday 21st March at 7 pm.
