## **A word from Fr Peter...**

Fr Peter has found that the only time he can address all of us in the Pastoral District at once is through the medium of the Grapevine. He writes:

Dear Friends in the Pastoral District of Southern Vales,

It has been a privilege beyond words to be entrusted with this pastorate and to be able to journey with you through the marvellous Season of Lent culminating in Holy Week, with the special three days, (The Triduum) and now we have begun the Great Fifty Days of Eastertide. I realize not all of us were able to worship at the same times in the same places, but would like to outline some of the times I shared with you.

Most memorable was Palm Sunday, when the weather was kind enough for us to enjoy the Palm Sunday Procession at Aldinga, led by the beautiful white donkey, "Shadow".

There were other wonderful moments in our pilgrimage as well. For me, another stand out was when the Passion according to St John was read at the Good Friday Liturgy at St Stephen's, with different voices joining in. I have attended many Good Friday Liturgies during my lifetime, with wonderful musical cadences etched into the memory from my youth of the beautifully sung setting of St John's Passion by Vittoria, and at the Veneration of the Cross, the glorious Setting of *The Reproaches (The Improperia)* by Palestrina. (Incidentally, by the wonder of the Internet, you can hear fine renditions of those beautiful Settings on *Youtube*). The little church of St Stephen at Willunga came alive at the afternoon Liturgy, as two highly practised lawyers led the telling of the story and Pontius Pilate's cross examination of Jesus. It was as though we were really there with Him and felt the impact of his trial as if newly told.

Then, another stand out moment was the prayer offered at the Blessing of the Baptismal Water (at the Easter Vigil, on Easter Eve). These prayers were slightly different from the ones I know so well, but struck me as being particularly beautiful, as the waters of the font were addressed in the second person: *And you, creature of water... Jesus Christ changed you into wine... whose feet walked upon you...*

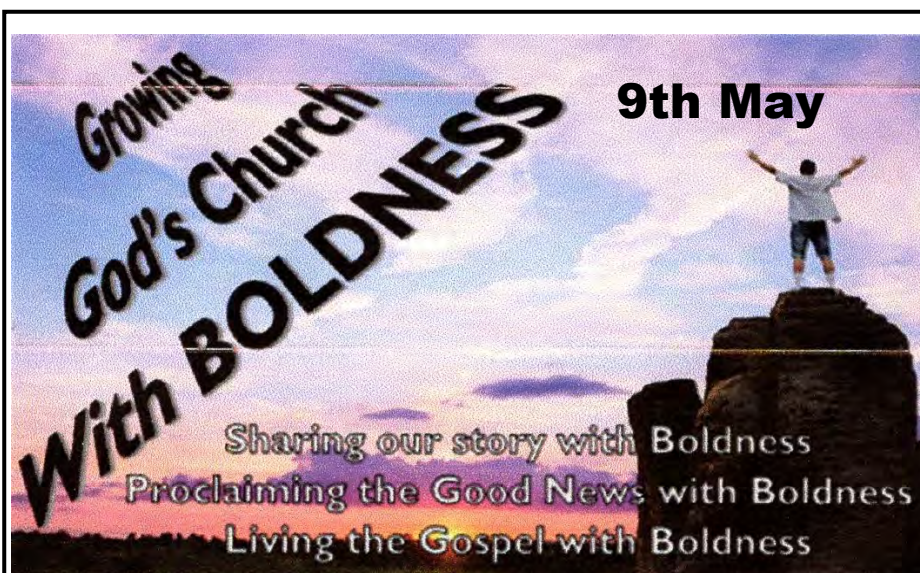
Then, on Easter Day, there was the water feature, in the baptistery at St Nicholas', Seaford. Who could have thought that the sound of running, cascading water could have been the backdrop for the renewal of our baptismal vows and the words of the *Vidi Aquam*, "*Lo I saw water, flowing from the right side of the temple. Alleluia!*" (a reference to the healing stream in Ezekiel's vision).

And now we enjoy the Great Fifty Days of Eastertide which will lead us into Ascensiontide, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and the Church's celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, (literally *fifty days* from Passover). Our Eastertide will be characterized by the wonderful Gospel accounts of the appearances of the risen Lord and the first apostolic preaching of the Resurrection (from Acts) and then take us, with passages from St John's Gospel, to the Great High Priestly Prayer (Chapter 17), Jesus' prayer for unity and his promise of mutual indwelling - the oneness of the Father and the Son, in which fellowship believers share, through the Spirit.

It is so good to be with you, to share the great themes of these days.

God bless you all and thank you for your kindness and your faith.

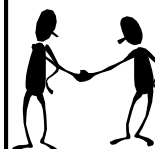

## Easter 2017

Learning (again) how to make palm crosses for Palm Sunday challenged not-so-nimble fingers and made for an afternoon of fun and fellowship at SEM. Fr Peter nobly joined the band of workers.

**Palm Sunday** was celebrated at St Ann's this year and we were delighted to have Shadow the donkey, led by her owner, Jim Lekkas, to lead the procession once again. In spite of unsettled weather, with gusty winds, it was a lovely day and a moving Service, with morning tea in the Room to follow. The Seaford Ecumenical Mission also held a Palm Sunday service.



The **Maundy Thursday** service at St Margaret's was a commemoration of the Last Supper and Jesus' washing of his disciples' feet. As Fr Peter pointed out, the name "Maundy" comes from the Latin *mando*, to command, and on this evening we remember his two commands: "do this in remembrance of me" and "love one another".

New hangings made by Julia Drought provided a beautiful backdrop, with the shadow of the cross falling on the splendour of purple and gold fabric.

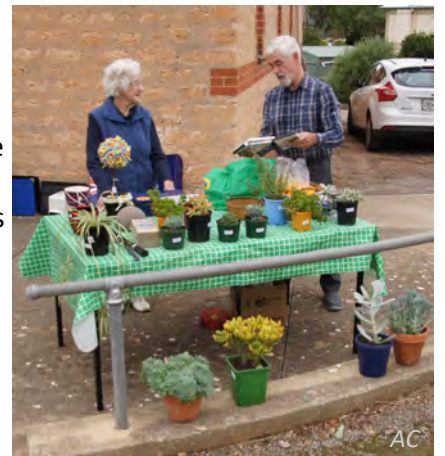

### ***News from St Nicholas, Seaford***

**Pastoral Care:** We have celebrated several birthdays and anniversaries this month and presented Christine Gunn with a rose bush for her backyard and a gift card, with thanks from the St Nicholas congregations for her 15 years as a Warden.

**Services:** Our services in April included a combined Palm Sunday liturgy of the Palms and Evensong on Tuesday of Holy Week and an Ecumenical combined Maundy Thursday service with washing of the feet. It was great to see so many people at the services during Holy Week, a fitting end to Lent and a great preparation for our Easter Celebrations. Our Easter Day service was presided over by Fr Peter with the service beginning in a darkened church with the blessing and lighting of the Pascal Candle by Fr Peter. From this candle the others were lit and the church lights undimmed as we all joined in singing Alleluia to the Risen Lord.

**Our Youth Worship** The young people in our congregation have given us another wonderful and thought-provoking service. This time the theme was “Peace” based on the gospel reading of the day when Jesus joined his disciples in the upper room following his resurrection and said “Peace be with you”. They performed a drama on the theme, using a play of the words *Peace and Piece*. This was followed by a short message on what this peace really meant and how in passing the peace each week we are not just saying, Hello or How are You, but, in fact, focusing our complete attention on the person to whom the peace is extended, sharing the reconciliation, unity, and love that are in Christ. It expresses an openness to the power of God’s love to heal our brokenness and make us agents of that love in the world. Or as they put it God’s *peace* can make our broken *pieces* whole again.

**Fellowship group:** We had a wonderful array of flowers for Easter Day, many thanks to those who purchased and arranged the flowers. The fellowship is supporting Lyn Hann in collecting toiletry items and handbags to make up bags for homeless women in the area. ## Weighty matters on the agenda...

On Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> April Bishop John met with wardens of Southern Vales, Fr Peter Thomson (part-time locum at Southern Vales to the end of July), Fr Max Bowers (part-time locum at Yankalilla/Delamere also to the end of July), Lyn King representing Yankalilla and Fr Peter Simmons (who will be half-time parish priest in the Ministry District from Ascension Day, 25<sup>th</sup> May) to discuss future ministry in our Ministry District. It is sincerely hoped that we will

have a priest by the end of the year, but even so, as a district with seven worshipping centres (although one not open at the present time) and up to two priests, we will not be able to have a main service in each centre each Sunday, and will have to work out different ways of doing things. This may involve holding services on different days of the week.

The Bishop noted four areas we need to consider in our strategic planning:

- Pastoral care of people (not just our congregations)
- Teaching the faith—including to newcomers and enquirers
- Evangelistic strategy—how do we reach out?
- Our liturgical plan

These four are linked together.

Bishop John emphasised that while some retired priests have indicated a willingness to be involved with us, these are a gift and a bonus. we must not depend on them as part of our mission strategy.

Not for the first time, those present recognised that we need to think outside the box about what opportunities we have and what new ventures could be tried. Some thinking had already been done on this, and it was good to hear from the priests present about what had worked elsewhere.
