Synod 2018

Synod 2018 was held at Woodcroft College. Sadly, Bishop John was not present as he had flown to England on the news that his mother was dying, so it was led by the Chancellor of the Diocese, Robert Tong. Prayers were offered for the bishop and his family at this sad time. The General Synod legislative changes which featured largely in the agenda were discussed, but will need to be passed at another call of Synod when the Bishop is present.

As well as the business matters which needed to be dealt with, there was an inspirational address on Saturday morning by the Rev'd John Warner, sharing ways to connect with people and communicate the faith, and outlining some simple but effective steps to introduce people to Jesus—steps which merit further study in our pastoral district.

Baptisms in the Anglican Diocese of Western Malaysia.

Matthew chapter 28: ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations and peoples, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. "

When we consider how we as a denomination are responding to Jesus' commission to us, we tend to try and imagine the calling in the context of our own faith tradition and experience. Our general Anglican experience is one in which children are baptised as infants and raised in the faith of the church until they make their own declarations of faith at their confirmation. We consider that talking about the faith is something done at Sunday school and at church, in the context of Lenten studies or even in a home Bible study. The assumption is that we are talking about our faith with others who also have faith and a church background. We do not consider that such an activity could be risky, stressful or dangerous, as "we are safely talking with our own kin".

However, this is not the commission that Jesus has given us. In present Australian society very few (8 people in 100) go to church once a month, and of those only a few go to Anglican churches. This means 92 of every 100 people we meet do not go to church, and many have never gone to church—nor, perhaps, have their parents. Jesus' commission is to go and make disciples of *all* peoples. Many of us, when we think of this, have a feeling of fear and dread and can't even imagine how we will even start.

I had the great privilege recently of worshiping amongst the people of the Anglican Diocese of Western Malaysia. These people are trying to respond to this commission with God's help in a nation where there are far fewer Christians, and very few who have any church experience. And worst of all, if they share the faith with those of the majority religion, they will be arrested and jailed.

In the midst of this, the Anglican Church in Malaysia is growing and sharing the faith, making disciples, and baptising people in the name of the Father, the



Son and the Holy Spirit. Here are some photos of a baptism service in which 29 people from the same village were baptised in one day. It was a great privilege to be a part of this day in the life of the village.

My friends, if our Anglican brothers and sisters in Malaysia, where Christians are persecuted, can have the courage to work out how to share their faith with people in their country who have never been Christians, and bring them into the discipleship of Christ, then perhaps we could muster up the courage and learn how to do the same here in our own parish.

... and Willunga was where it all happened this month!

(L) On Thursday 17th May Bishop John blessed Willunga House as the Mother House of the Society of the Sacred Mission. He prayed that Willunga House might be a holy place where people would experience encounters with God. Australian-based Members of the Society attended their Chapter during the week, and an address on the theology of place was given by the Rev'd Philip Tolliday (R) The candles in the basket were made specially by Sr Bev for use in Willunga House.

(Below) Several Anglicans attended the service of Prayer for Christian Unity at the Uniting Church, Willunga, on the 21st May. The service was prepared by the people of the Caribbean, with the theme *Break the Chains! The power of the Gospel bringing freedom from bondage*. The service and the readings reflected the power of God to liberate people from all that binds them, and give hope in troubled times. The service was organised by Jenny Esots, and the message was given by the Rev. Cogs Smith (Uniting Church).

Peter Laffan (Roman Catholic), Ted Sandercock (Anglican) and Tim Castle-Schmidt (Lutheran) symbolically loosed chains that held them.



Snippets from Western Fleurieu Anglicans Council, 15th May

The meeting was held at St Ann's and chaired by Ted Sandercock. Matters discussed included the following:

Mission Action Plan: A review is needed, to recognise and consolidate in the face of current developments in our Pastoral District. A meeting to be set for August.

Sale of St Philip & St James' Church, Old Noarlunga: A Letter from Stephen Carthew was the occasion to revisit matters discussed at the "Future of our parish" meeting of the 3rd April. Stephen, who attended the meeting as an observer but was invited to speak, spoke of the location of the churches, and emphasised the importance of each church's connecting with the community and the value of large event services such as the Blessing of the Fleece at Delamere. He also proposed the setting up of an Investment Trust for each centre. This would be discussed at a later meeting.

John Strachan, Synod Solicitor for the Diocese of The Murray, noted that there was a caveat on a portion of the SSPJ land, that it was to be used for a house for the clergy. This would mean that the sale as proposed would in fact be fulfilling the purpose of the caveat! The irony was that the deed had been signed in London, presumably by someone with no knowledge of the fact that the section of land under the caveat was in fact a cliff area which could never have held a building!

John indicated that a Parochial Administration Ordinance required certain procedures to be carried out before the sale of the church, with a resolution to be read out in each church of the Western Fleurieu Anglican district (the date was set for the 20th / 27th May) and any objections to the sale to be considered. A meeting to confirm the resolution was set for the 19th June, 2018. Any objections to the resolution need to be put in writing and given to Fr Simon or Parish Secretary by Monday 4th June.

Fr Simon, who had met with representatives of the Onkaparinga Council at Old Noarlunga, observed that shops had closed, and the local community appeared to have collapsed owing to its proximity to Seaford. He had received an email from the grandson of the donor of the SSPJ land with the caveat—who said he believed that his grandmother would be pleased with plans to use money from the land to build a future for the church.

WFA Website: This was a work in progress. Lorraine Nitschke had held training sessions so that people were equipped to add information to the calendar and Posts, and load *The Grapevine*. Where an event is listed in the calendar, to click on it will bring up further information about the event, and it is hoped that people will learn to make regular use of this. Photos were needed to bring life to the website. A special vote of thanks to Lorraine for her hard work and continued support.

Consideration needs to be given to an attractive visual for the opening page of our mission partnership on the diocesan website. If you have ideas to share please contact Jane Cuthbert.

Finance report: The Treasurer reported that our income this year is down, and our expenses are up, as we are paying a full stipend. Our current deficit of nearly \$12,000 gives grounds for serious concern. We still have expenses attached to SSPJ even though the centre is no longer open.

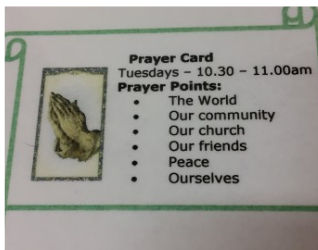

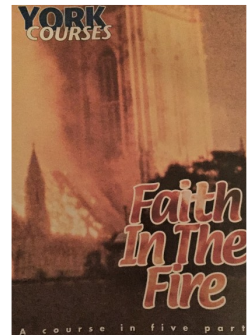


Youth Worship: Trinity Sunday gave our youth the opportunity to be creative in trying to explain the “Mystery of Faith”. An intriguing drama, based on a conversation between the three persons of the Trinity, God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit, gave us pause for thought as well as a few chuckles!! The conclusion of the conversation suggested that instead of trying to understand the Trinity we should just live it each day, trusting in God who created us all, Jesus who redeemed us all and the Holy Spirit who enlightens us all.



Prayer Group We meet at 10.15am each Tuesday with prayer for the local community, the church, and any personal requests. For those who are unable to attend the prayers, we have put together a “Prayer Card”. The idea is that even when people cannot be with us in person they can still join with us in our weekly prayers.

Special Events Big Morning Tea – SCC via the Café is taking part in this annual fundraiser for cancer. The event will be held in the Café on Tuesday 5th June at 10.30 am at a cost of \$10 per plate of goodies and bottomless tea or coffee. All proceeds will go to the Cancer Council.

Seaford Christian Churches (SCC): At our workshop on Saturday 19th May we finally began to put together a new and simplified structure for SCC(SEM); the beginnings of a structure that all parties could agree on. There is still work to be done finalising and fine tuning the ideas, but we believe, along with everyone at the meeting, that we are finally on the right track to have a formal structure ready for our AGM later this year. On a more positive note, as an interim measure while re-structure is in progress, the Committee of Management has agreed to reduce the levy for members at SCC to \$7.50 per head from the 1st July. This will mean a reduction of \$4600 pa in St Nicholas’s levy to SCC. We are hoping the levy will be reduced even further once restructure is complete and our Lease payments to the owners reduced.
