Following the service there was a luncheon including hot soup in the Sunday School room, and Fr Brenton and Lyn were presented with a hamper from the Western Fleurieu Anglicans. They will be living in the Rectory at McLaren Vale. Fr Simon and his family have moved to the new clergy house at Seaford Meadows.



Safe Practice in our Diocese—should you be attending a course?

There has been some confusion over the two Safe Ministry courses required by the Diocese, and who has to do which.

To present it in its simplest form:

All licensed clergy and all those involved in leadership of worship, anyone involved in children's and youth ministry, or ministry to the elderly and vulnerable, all official hospital or home visitors, choir directors, churchwardens and paid up shop managers must:

- i) **do both the Safe Ministry course *and* the Child Safe Environment Course**
- ii) **have a police check**
- iii) **fill in the Diocesan Safe Ministry Screening Questionnaire**

and each of these must be updated every three years.

The meeting was chaired by Ted Sandercock, and matters discussed included the following:

Sale of St Philip & St James' Church, Old Noarlunga:

The matter was now in the hands of Diocesan Council. A list has been made of the contents of the church, so decisions can be made on what should be kept. Advice to be sought from past SSPJ parishioners. Those items transferring to St Margaret's church would need a new faculty. The future of the cemetery needs further exploration. It is still in our care, but no new leases will be sold.

Clergy rosters:

It had been decided that Fr Brenton would live in the rectory at McLaren Vale and his ministry would primarily be in McLaren Vale and Willunga, taking all the Wednesday and Saturday services, and three Sunday services a month at St Margaret's. Fr Simon has moved with his family into a new rectory at 17 Shell Street, Seaford Meadows, and will have an office at Seaford Christian Churches (SEM). He is hoping to develop an additional all-parish service at 4 pm on Sunday afternoons at SCC, followed by shared tea. The young people from SCC are keen to help with this.

The **Yankalilla Rectory** is in need of a lot of repair. A list to be drawn up of what needs to be done, and in what order of priority.

An **Anglican Expo** is being organized by the pastoral district of Southern Suburbs for Sunday 9th September from 1-5 pm at Seaford Christian Churches, to show people in the area the range of Anglican activities that are undertaken.

The Rev'd E. K. Miller, Church of England rector of Willunga for forty years, had pioneered recreational grounds and was instrumental in bringing rail to McLaren Vale and Willunga. An E. K. Miller memorial service and dinner had been suggested by Stephen Carthew. It could be held, for example, at the Willunga Football Club. It was felt that should this happen, it would provide an interesting point of contact between the church and the community.
