- **Setting our table for our Sunday lunch service.**

Sometimes we eat, in front of the TV either together or alone; we eat on the run; we eat out in restaurants or even in our car; but today we sit at a table that we have set for our Sunday lunch meal. It is our everyday altar of life-giving food.

- **Prayerful and intentional preparation for a meal**

As we worship at home today let us define the occasion by adding something special to our table. Give some thought to the presentation of our meal as a meditation on the importance of the time we are setting aside for worship.



They saw his glory



The Transfiguration of Jesus signifies God's confirmation of His mission through Jesus in the redemption of the whole world. It was from this time on that Jesus began his journey to Jerusalem. He knew that in Jerusalem he would be rejected and crucified. Just before the transfiguration and after, He tells His disciples that he will be killed but he will raise again. 8:31 & 9:30. They see Jesus resplendent in God's glory, they see the cloud of God descend over Him, Elijah and Moses, they Hear God speak and say "This is my Son, listen to Him." But they do not comprehend God's mission. Understanding God's ways can be like this. In telling

Jesus he will make three shelters, is Peter's attempt to make sense of what had just happened. We too, try to make sense of God's ways only to fall so very short in our understanding. Quite often, if we sit and be still, listening for his voice, He shows us where He lead us from and tells us where we are going and our understanding becomes a gift from Him and not of our own.

- **opening prayer — consciously drawing together in our mind our Parish community around our table.**

Be still and silent. Visualise in your mind, those whom you invited to share with you. Pray:



In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Here, and throughout the world, We adore you O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world. Amen

Bless this food, both physical and spiritual. Bless all who gather at your table, both seen and unseen, In Jesus' name we pray. Amen

- **Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings**



A reading from the second book of Kings, Chapter 2 beginning at Verse 1

¹ Now when the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha

were on their way from Gilgal. ² Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; for the Lord has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. ³ The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?" And he said, "Yes, I know; keep silent."

⁴ Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here; for the Lord has sent me to Jericho." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they came to Jericho. ⁵ The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know; be silent."

⁶ Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; for the Lord has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. ⁷ Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. ⁸ Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground.



⁹ When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you." Elisha said, "Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit." ¹⁰ He responded, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not." ¹¹ As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. ¹² Elisha kept watching and crying out, "Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.

- ¹ The Lord our God, the Mighty One, has spoken:
and summoned the earth,
from the rising of the sun to its setting in the west.
- ² From Zion, perfect in beauty:
God has shone out in glory.

before him is devouring fire,
and tempest whirls about him.
- ⁴ He calls to the heavens above:
and to the earth, so he may judge his people.
- ⁵ 'Gather to me my faithful ones:
those who by sacrifice made a covenant with me.'
- ⁶ The heavens shall proclaim his righteousness:
for God himself is judge.




A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 4 beginning at Verse 3

³ And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of

the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

⁷ But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. ⁸ We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹ persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰ always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. ¹¹ For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. ¹² So death is at work in us, but life in you. Hear the word of the Lord,

thanks be to God.



The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark, Chapter 9 beginning at Verse 2

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.



² Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, ³ and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. ⁴ And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. ⁵ Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings,^[c] one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." ⁶ He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. ⁷ Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" ⁸ Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. ⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to

tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. This is the Gospel of the Lord,

praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Sentence

It is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

- ***Let us now engage in some quiet reflection, or conversation and sharing, responding to the Gospel passage. We may like to write down some key thoughts for further reflection.***

God shines forth - We have this treasure in Clay Jars

David in the Psalm says "Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God shines forth." The readings tell us of the light of God that shines through Christ our Lord. This light though seen on the mount of Transfiguration, it is also everything that God is, His virtues, His righteousness, His Goodness, and of course, His love for us. If you watched someone walking towards a powerful spotlight somehow the light seems to surround the shape of that person. So it is, if we seek to draw nearer to God His light engulfs us, we too then enter into the transfiguration of the light of Christ. It is His light that transforms us, as we partake in all that He is. Paul tells the Corinthians; For it is God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. And he gives us the reason, "So that the life of Jesus may be visible in our mortal flesh."


