PENTECOST 2

Let us sit and watch Songs of Praise together on the ABC and then set the table for our Parish meal.



- **Setting our table for our Sunday lunch service.**

Sometimes we eat, in front of the TV either together or alone; we eat on the run; we eat out in restaurants or even in our car; but today we sit at a table that we have set for our Sunday lunch meal. It is our everyday altar of life-giving food.



Set your table and prepare your meal as a meditation on the importance of the time you are setting aside for worship. If you are celebrating this meal without people physically present, please be aware that **God Is With You.**



Family is important, it is where we feel we belong, the place where we are most accepted for who we are. Jesus in this gospel is doing and saying things that is shaking up the status quo. His family were concerned people would misunderstand him and rightfully so, the Pharisees were saying He was working for Satan. Sometimes people do things in our world that is different or beyond what we think should be normal. Jesus casting out demons was very surprising for many, and they struggled to explain it, only to cause criticism and judgment. They never stopped and asked is this a good thing? The one set free from the insidious oppression could have told them the truth.

- **opening prayer — consciously drawing together in our mind our Parish community around our table.**

Be still and silent.
Visualise in your mind,
those whom you invited to share with you. Pray:



In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Here, and throughout the world,

We adore you O Christ, and we bless you,

because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world. Amen

Bless this food, both physical and spiritual.

Bless all who gather at your table, both seen and unseen, In Jesus' name we pray. Amen

- **Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings**

A reading from the first book of Samuel, Chapter 8 beginning at Verse 4

4 Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, 5 and said to him, "You are old and your sons do not follow in your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other nations." 6 But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to govern us." Samuel prayed to the Lord, 7 and the Lord said to



Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. 8 Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so also they are doing to you. 9 Now then, listen to their voice; only—you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them." 10 So Samuel reported all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking him for a king. 11 He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen, and to run before his chariots; 16 He will take your male and female slaves, and the best of your cattle and donkeys, and put them to his work. 17 He will take one-tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. 18 And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves; but the Lord will not answer you in that day." 19 But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said, "No! but we are determined to have a king over us, 20 so that we also may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go out before us and fight our battles." Hear the word of the Lord, **thanks be to God**

Psalm 138 we will say alternate verses

1 I will give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart:
even before the gods will I sing your praises.

2 I will bow down toward your holy temple
and give thanks to your name:

because of your faithfulness and your loving-kindness,
for you have made your name and your word
supreme over all things.

3 At a time when I called to you, you gave me answer:
and put new strength within my soul.


4 All the kings of the earth shall praise you, O Lord:

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 4 beginning at Verse 13

13 But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—"I believed, and so I spoke"—we also believe, and so we speak, 14 because we know that the one who raised the

Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. 15 Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. 16 So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. 17 For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, 18 because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.




1For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark Chapter 3 beginning at verse 20

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus went home with his disciples, and the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." And Jesus called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered. "Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin"— for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit." Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Sentence

• eating reflectively and responding to the passage

Let us now engage in some quiet reflection, or conversation and sharing, responding to the Gospel passage. We may like to write down some key thoughts for further reflection.

Our inner nature is being renewed day by day.

The Lord will fulfill his purpose for me; your steadfast love, O Lord, endures forever.

Have you been on a bush trip with someone experienced in seeing the hidden things in the bush. He can point out tracks and animals that were invisible to us a second ago. We are filled with wonder at what nature hides for us to find. Paul says that we should look at the things we cannot



see. He does explain himself. When we look at the things eternal we are looking at the things the Holy Spirit reveals to our souls. Yes, the Holy Spirit is like the bushman pointing out things that are not so obvious to us, that is why it is so important to walk close to Him or we may miss out on the wonders that God wants to show us. Our journey is not to live in the mundane repetitive, but to find the extraordinary in God's kingdom and share these with others.

• **spending time together in prayer**
