Palm Sunday, April 10 2022

In the name of Jesus, every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 2:10-11

Collect

God of all, you gave your only-begotten Son to take the form of a servant and to be obedient even to death on a cross: give us the same mind that was in Christ Jesus that, sharing in his humility, we may come to be with him in his glory, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Thought for the Week: In today's reading from St Luke we read how Jesus was received as he made his entry into Jerusalem. It was a parody of an *adventus*, the ceremonial arrival of a Roman governor into his province. This would have been with a warhorse decked out in its State finery and, one imagines, not-so enthusiastic onlookers at the sides of the road, looking and the imperial might of the occupying force. Jesus upends this, arriving on a lowly donkey as the crowds shouted praises to God 'for all the deeds of power that they had seen' done by Jesus.

- Jesus Christ, coming to save us from our sins, may I always enthusiastically praise you for all the good things you have done, both for others and for me.

When all are gathered (with palm crosses and this booklet), the Celebrant begins:

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.



A minister addresses the people in these or similar words

This morning begins the Great Week of the Christian Year. During Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of the Lord's death and resurrection. With Christians throughout the world, we come together this week to call to mind, and to express in word and action, the centre of the Easter mystery: our Lord's Passover from death to life.

Christ entered in triumph into the Holy City to complete his work as Messiah: to suffer, to die and to rise to new life. Today we commit ourselves to walk the way of the cross, so that, sharing his sufferings, we may be united with him in his risen life.

All may hold up their palms for this blessing, said by the Celebrant.

Sovereign God, we thank you for these branches [and crosses] of palm.

By your blessing may they be for us signs of the victory of your Son. May we who carry them in his name ever hail him as our Messiah, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Palm Gospel: Luke 19:28-40

*The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Hosanna in the highest.***

After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

*This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord***
