
If you are celebrating this meal alone please be aware that God Is With You.

Have you ever been questioned over what you have said, though you are quoting facts and facts that seem obvious. Sometimes we read the bible but miss the point, God does things God's way. Here the Pharisees and Levites struggled to believe John, even when they knew the words of the



prophets in detail. Mary however, had no struggle understanding that Her child would one day be the fulfilment of God's promise to Israel. And John puts it that he testifies to the light, that the Messiah is amongst them. A light among them and they still could not see. Belief is not blind but trusting that God is with us and will fulfil his promises and fulfilling them His way.

Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 61 v 1-4,8-11

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring

good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion — to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the

planting of the Lord, to display his glory. They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.

For I the Lord love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the Lord has blessed. I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause

A reading from the first letter to the Thessalonians 5 12-28

We appeal to you, brothers and sisters, to respect those who labour among you, and have charge of you in the Lord and admonish you; esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. And we urge you, beloved, to admonish the idlers, encourage the faint hearted, help the weak, be patient with all of them. See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for







this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise the words of prophets, but test everything; hold fast to what is good; abstain from every form of evil. May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this. Beloved, pray for us. Greet all the brothers and sisters with a holy kiss. I solemnly command you by the Lord that this letter be read to all of them. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John1:6-8, 19-28 Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.



There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from

Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No." Then

they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,'" as the prophet Isaiah said. Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, "Why then are you baptising if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptise with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptising.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Sentence

Bind up the broken-hearted, proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, proclaim the year of the Lord's favour, the day of vengeance of our God. Isaiah 61.1-2

Let us now engage in some quiet reflection, or conversation and sharing, responding to the Gospel passage. We may like to write down some key thoughts for further reflection.

May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this.

John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know,.

The Pharisees and Levites believed they had worked out God and therefore believed God would do what they expected. We too can fall into this trap even telling God in our prayers how He should work things out. We forget the Lord's Prayer, "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

When Jesus came into this world He broke all expectations. Born in an animal shelter, announced incognito by a vagrant desert dweller. There was no royal



presentation, no formal ceremony involving dignitaries promoting His importance. His ministry alone spoke of who He is. Why should not Jesus continue to be this way today? The fact is how he chooses to be present in our lives is up to him. The evidence of His work is how our faith grows when we trust God this way. He reveals Himself within our souls, far more than tangible experiences.


