


SUNDAY TABLE SERVICE 10th March 2024 Mothering Sunday Let us watch Songs of Praise together on the ABC and then set the table for our shared meal.



• Setting our table for our Sunday lunch service.

Sometimes we eat, in front of the TV either together or alone; we eat on the run; we eat out in in restaurants or even in our car; but today we sit at a table that we have set for our Sunday lunch meal. It is our everyday altar of life-giving food.

• Prayerful and intentional preparation for a meal

As we worship at home today let us give some thought to the presentation of our meal, let our table reflect the importance of the season of lent, a time of reflection, prayer and fasting.





The foundation of salvation has nothing to do about how good we can be. It is everything about God's love for us and simply accepting this unconditional love. It sounds too easy doesn't it? In this reading Jesus is talking theological jargon to the greatest religions jewish teacher of the time. Jesus uses Nicodemus's language to explain

salvation. Not the quick fix kind that is tied up in rules, but the kind that makes life worth living simply by trusting. The kind that engulfs our souls, and outlasts our mortal frames. So He tells Nicodemus about His impending death. The snake lifted up story, Nicodemus knew it all to well; but its meaning he now knew even more.

It spelt out redemption and forgivness and God's love for humanity. God reaching us, beyond our own attempts to save ourselves.

opening prayer — consciously drawing together in our mind our Parish community around our table.

Be still and silent. Visualise in your mind, those whom you invited to share with you. Pray:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.


Here, and throughout the world, We adore you O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world. Amen

Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings

A reading from the book of Numbers, *Chapter* 21 *beginning at Verse* 4 From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. ⁵ The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why



have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." ⁶ Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. ⁷ The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸ And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." ⁹ So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians, Chapter 2 beginning at Verse 1

¹You were dead through the trespasses and sins ² in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. ³All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. ⁴But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us ⁵ even when we



Hear the word of the Lord,

were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ - by grace you have been saved - ⁶ and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷ so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God - ⁹ not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰ For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.



The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John, Chapter 3 beginning at Verse 14 Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

¹⁴ And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵ that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶ "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

¹⁷ "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Those who



believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in



the name of the only Son of God. ¹⁹ And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. 20 For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed.²¹ But those who do what is true come to the

light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God." This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Sentence

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son .that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16

Let us now engage in some quiet reflection, or conversation and sharing, responding to the Gospel passage. We may like to write down some key thoughts for further reflection.

For God did not send his Son into the world. Whoever lives by the truth comes into the light.

Jesus made it very clear to Nicodemus. As the Hebrews looked to the snake raised up on a staff in

the desert for their healing; so Jesus would bring healing to those who look to Him. By looking, the meaning really is about putting our trust in what He has done and what He brings to our souls. This is a belief not so much in the theology, but in how God reaches us in a deep and Spiritual way. A spiritual healing that opens us up to a way of living that is liberating for our souls. This is the "God so loved" that Jesus mentions.



prayer-time Now let us continue to offer our prayers and thanksgiving. We pray for healing of the



world; Lord, we ask for peace in all nations throughout the world . We pray for all those suffering from the effects of natural disasters, floods, fire and storms. Protect all those who are vulnerable to the effects of war and displacement from their homes. Give those in authority the patience, humility, wisdom and endurance to persevere in bringing about positive solutions to conflict. Amen. We pray for family; for members of the parish and wider community, for the life

and ministry of the Church, for encouragement in our journey of faith.


