TRINITY SUNDAY

Let us sit and watch Songs of Praise together on the ABC and then set the table for our Parish meal.



Setting our table for our Sunday lunch service.

Sometimes we eat, in front of the TV either together or alone; we eat on the run; we eat out in in restaurants or even in our car; but today we sit at a table that we have set for our Sunday lunch meal. It is our everyday altar of life-giving food.





TODAY is Trinity Sunday, a time to reflect on the wonder and glory of our God, as the Father Son and Holy Spirit, Let us decorate our table to reflect the occasion. Set you table and prepare you meal as a meditation on the importance of the time you are setting aside for worship. If you are celebrating this meal without people physically present, please be aware that **God Is With You**.

The reading in John 3 is one of the most profound conversations in the Gospels. Jesus is speaking to Nicodemus. He was the teacher of all Rabbi teachers. Jesus uses Nicodemus's style of language to converse with him. He spoke about two significant changes in a person's life. The first, Nicodemus understood. Baptism in water was a Jewish ritual of ceremonial cleansing before presenting an offering to God. It demonstrated not only a purification of the body but a renewal or rebirth of the soul.

opening prayer — consciously drawing together in our mind our Parish community around our table.

Be still and silent.
Visualise in your mind, those whom you invited to share with you.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
Here, and throughout the world,
We adore you O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world. Amen
Bless this food, both physical and spiritual.
Bless all who gather at your table, both seen and unseen,
In Jesus' name we pray. Amen



Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings A reading from the prophet Isaiah Chapter 6.1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those

who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saving, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

- Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven: ascribe to the Lord glory and might.

A reading from the Letter to the Romans Chapter 8 12-17

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh



— for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ — if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. Thanks be to God. Hear the word of the Lord.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Chapter 3 1-17

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no

one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.'

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? "Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about

heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.


Sentence
