Prayerful and intentional preparation for a meal

As we celebrate today let us define the occasion by adding something special to our table, Give some thought to the presentation of our meal as a meditation on the importance of the time we are setting aside for worship.

If you are celebrating this meal without people physically present, please be aware that **God Is With You.**



In the Gospels Jesus teaches about living in a kingdom that is both tangible and Spiritual. A world that finds the positive in the midst of all that is negative. This means living in an authority that affects change and transformation for the better. An authority where everything that represents God's sovereignty can be expressed

through our own lives. Though we live in this world we now belong to another simply by embracing all that Jesus is. Something St Paul found out the hard way.

Be still and silent.

Visualise in your mind, those whom you invited to share with you.

Bless this food, both physical and spiritual.

Bless all who gather at your table, both seen and unseen,
In Jesus' name we pray. Amen



Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings

A reading from the Second Book of Samuel Chapter 5 verses 1-5 10

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron, and said, 'Look, we are your bone and flesh. For some time, while Saul was king over us, it was you who led out Israel and brought it in. The Lord



said to you: It is you who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you who shall be ruler over Israel.' So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron; and King David made a covenant with them at Hebron before the Lord, and they anointed David king over Israel. David was thirty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned forty years. At Hebron he reigned

over Judah seven years and six months; and at Jerusalem he reigned over all Israel and Judah thirty-three years. David occupied the stronghold, and named it the city of David. David built the

city all around from the Millo inward. And David became greater and greater, for the Lord, the God of hosts, was with him. Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Psalm 48 — A.P.B.A. Page 270

1 Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised: in the city of our God.

2 High and beautiful is his holy hill: it is the joy of all the earth.

3 On Mount Zion where godhead truly dwells stands the city of the Great King:

God is well known in her palaces as a sure defence.

4 For the kings of the earth assembled:

they gathered together and came on;

5 They saw they were struck dumb:

A reading from the second letter to the Corinthians Chapter 12 verses 2-10

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven — whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person — whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows — was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh,




a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark Chapter 6 verses 1-13 Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus went to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, 'Where did this man get all



this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their hometown, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief. Then he went about among the

villages teaching. He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear



you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.' So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Sentence

Of Jesus many said, 'What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands?'. Mark 6.2

Let us now engage in some quiet reflection, or conversation and sharing, responding to the Gospel passage. We may like to write down some key thoughts for further reflection.

Corr. v6. If I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. Ps. 14. God, our God forever and ever. He will be our guide forever.

Paul was a man passionate for God and his religion. When Christianity began to spread he sought out their leaders to kill them. He found his world came crashing to the ground, blinded by the laws he followed. Suddenly he comes face to face with Jesus, more so His authority. In this he finds he



has been fighting against God Himself. He discovers a world turned upside down to the one he knows. A world that invites us all to live in, where a new way to love conquers hatred and death and all that corrupts. From then on he writes about how we can live in this world; the kingdom that Jesus spoke about. His letters form more than half the New Testament Bible.
