Prayerful and intentional preparation for a meal

Sometimes we eat, in front of the TV either together or alone; we eat on the run; we eat out in restaurants or even in our car; but today we sit at a table that we have set for our Sunday lunch meal. It is our everyday altar of life-giving food.

As we worship at home today let us define the occasion by adding something special to our table. Give some thought to the presentation of our meal as a meditation on the importance of the time we are setting aside for worship. If you are celebrating this meal without people physically present, please be aware that **God Is With You.**



We often take just one little step in faith but never know the outcome, what happened. One step is all that is needed. A step of kindness, or compassion, and hearts are healed. Maybe a step towards forgiveness or reconciliation and walls come tumbling down. Jesus teaches us that this is a powerful thing, and those who have taken that step know it to be true.

Bless this food, both physical and spiritual.

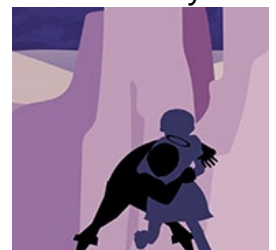
Bless all who gather at your table, both seen and unseen, In Jesus' name we pray.

Let us read and reflect on our cycle of readings.

A reading from the book of Genesis. Chapter 32, verses 22-31

Jacob got up, took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, 'Let me go, for the day is breaking.' But Jacob said, 'I will not let you go, unless you bless me.' So he said to him, 'What is your name?' And he said, 'Jacob.' Then the man said,



'You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed.' Then Jacob asked him, 'Please tell me your name.' But he said, 'Why is it that you ask my name?' And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, 'For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved.' The sun rose upon him as he passed Peniel, limping because of his hip.

Psalm 17, verses 1-7, 16

1 Hear my just cause O Lord give heed to my cry:
listen to my prayer that comes from no lying lips.

**2 Let judgement for me come forth from your presence:
and let your eyes discern the right.**

3 Though you search my heart and visit me in the night-time:
though you try me by fire you will find no wickedness in me.

**4 My mouth does not transgress like the mouth of others:
for I have kept the word of your lips.**

5 My steps have held firm in the way of your commands:
and my feet have not stumbled from your paths.

**6 I call upon you O God for you will surely answer:
incline your ear to me and hear my words.**

7 Show me the wonders of your steadfast love

O saviour of those who come to you for refuge:

who by your right hand deliver them from those that rise up against them.

**16 And I also shall see your face because my cause is just:
when I awake and see you as you are I shall be satisfied.**



A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans. Chapter 9, verses 1-8

I am speaking the truth in Christ. I am not lying; my conscience confirms it by the Holy Spirit. I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the



covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; to them belong the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, comes the Messiah, who is over all, God blessed for ever. Amen. It is not as though the word of God had failed. For not all Israelites truly belong to Israel, and not all of Abraham's children are his true descendants; but "It is through Isaac that descendants shall

be named for you." This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but the children of the promise are counted as descendants.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Chapter 14, verses 13-21

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

When Jesus heard that Herod had beheaded John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them

and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves.' Jesus said to them, 'They need not go away; you give them something to eat.' They replied, 'We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.' And he said, 'Bring them here to me.' Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass.



Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Sentence

The Lord is near to all who call on him in truth. He fulfils the desire of all that fear him, hears their cry, and saves them. Psalm 145.18-19

Let us now engage in some quiet reflection, or conversation and sharing, responding to the passages of scripture. We may like to write down some key thoughts for further reflection.

**The LORD is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made.
He saw a great crowd and He had compassion.**



In today's gospel Jesus had compassion for the people and someone took a tiny step to meet that compassion. One little boy gave away his lunch to help out. The disciples questioned it, how could so little help so many? The rest is recorded in history. We never know until we try; but try with the right motives. God does and will enter into the gift we bring. It is not up to us to dictate what happens next, but often it grows; because that is what blessings do.
